

I, William Little, of the County of Franklin, State of New York, do hereby make my last will and testament in manner & form following: I do declare my true sons Philander Little & William Little my sole heirs at Law - and give and bequeath to them & the survivors of them & his heirs forever, all my estate real personal or mixed whatsoever, to William all the estate which came by his mother, and also majority of the residue of my estate, & to Philander the other moiety, of my estate independent of what was received thro' William's mother -

Secondly - I hereby appoint the Rev. Geo. S. Chapman of Saratoga & the Rev. Wm. Coleman of Frankfort, Guardians to my two children

Thirdly - I constitute & appoint, my friend Jacob Sargent of Frankfort, sole executor, of this my last will and testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of August 1824

I Priscilla Church being conscious of my frailty of mortality, do hereby make my last will and testament in manner & form following: I do declare my true sons Philander Little & William Little my sole heirs at Law - and give and bequeath to them & the survivors of them & his heirs forever, all my estate real personal or mixed whatsoever, to William all the estate which came by his mother, and also majority of the residue of my estate, & to Philander the other moiety, of my estate independent of what was received thro' William's mother -

I will bequeath & devise to my uncle William Church six hundred Dollars for the following purpose to wit: the said six hundred dollars to be remain in his hands as a trustee for Margaret Wadswell my cousin, & my said Uncle Wm Church is to pay her the interest on the said sum of six hundred dollars with the moneys or come of the age of twenty one and on the happening further want I will that the said sum of six hundred dollars be paid over to her by my uncle Wm Church (who is hereinafter appointed my executor) & is absolutely at her disposal I do desire that my said Uncle Church who is appointed to

I if my debt & owing thereon as a legatee

1st I will bequeath and devise to my cousin Seth Church the sum of 100 my Executors my negro boy & want to him & his heirs forever

2nd I will bequeath and devise to my cousin Mary Church my negro girl Phoebe a bed & her chest to her & his heirs forever

3rd I give & bequeath to my Executor William Church two hundred dollars to be expended in the purchase of a tract of Land which said tract, of Land is to be held by him & his heirs forever for the use of James Bryan Church my brother & his heirs

4th I will and bequeath to my said Brother James Bryan Church my mare & a saddle now in my possession but I do hereby revoke both this bequest & the one immediately preceding for his benefit if he should prosecute a suit to set a side the will of my deceased father which was recently proven in the County Court of Franklin and it is my will that he receive no part of my property but on condition that he will bring no such suit.

5th I will bequeath & devise to my uncle William Church my land to him and his heirs forever, all my just property real personal & mixed which I have not otherwise disposed of herein & do also make him and his heirs my receiver, as well as ordinary Legatee in the contingency of the reversion of the property by the failure of the said bequest by the condition thereof, or for any cause whatsoever

6th I do hereby appoint my uncle William Church the executor of this my last will & testament.

7th I do hereby further will that in case my Brother & Bryan Church should attempt, and succeed in setting aside my fathers will lately proven in Court that the half of my fathers estate to which I am entitled as heir, by Law be divided and the same is hereby bequeathed & devised to my Executor, William Church for the purpose of giving to each of my Legates a portion of my half part & for said proportion to the several Legates given with will including himself as a residuary Legatee after & I do submit the division thereof may thus become necessary to make of my half part, after the Subsequent & discretion of my said Uncle Wm Church who is hereby appointed my Executor & is absolutely at his disposal I do desire that my said Uncle Church who is appointed to
