

I Robert Alexander of Maryland County and state
of Kentucky, do hereby make and declare this to be
my last will and testament as follows: The whole
of my estate in the United States of America
in my decease shall be vested in my son

Robert Alexander and my friends Isaac Sargent
Joseph Messers and John H. Slaughter (who
are hereby appointed my executors) in trust
for the following purposes. 1st That the benefit
of my wife during her life and to provide for
the support and suitable maintenance & education
of our children. 2^d In the event of the death
of my wife, then my said estate to be for the
benefit of each of my children divided in
the United States, in equal portions. The
trustee or a majority of them who may accept
the trust, with the concurrence of my son

Robert, should he should not act or acted
with full power and authority to dispose of all
any of the property thus vested for them and
to invest the proceeds in other property &
funds which they may think more profitable
or beneficial and safe. The trustee shall
retain the title to the property which may
fall to my daughters or convey it and direct
to other trustees so as to prevent its being
squandered, and thus make my children
to retain the use and benefit of it. If my

son Alexander John Alexander should become
an inhabitant of Great Britain, or vice versa
the said estate and all it take possession
thereof as such then his portion of my estate
in the United States of America shall be
divided between my four or three children who
remain here. I hereby bequeath to Robert
my debts and all the right and interest which
I possess, or may have or claim in Great Britain.
If any would should want it out of the power of
my son Robert to take possession of his said
estate, on the death of his uncle, I declare of
myself then he is to share my estate in the
United States with any other children who are
inhabitants of the United States. And among
may be made to any of the children who
may be deemed by the trustee to be a company
it. I appoint that the money retained in the

Education and support of my children shall
be made a charge against the same, and I
intend that any trust placed any trust
may of they think it expedient, when a child
is to my youngest son, his portion of my estate
shall be paid to another if they think it would
be generally managed by him, but I hope it will
not be necessary to assist him in the absolute
control of his property. My last and final

The last will and testament of Robert Alexander
deceased was produced in court and proved by the
oaths of John Dudley and Harrison Bellinger to be
written wholly in the hand writing of the decedent
and ordered to be recorded. Whereupon Isaac Sargent
Joseph Messers and John H. Slaughter the trustee
and executors therein named came into court took the
oath prescribed by law and executed a deed in fee simple
of \$35000 with 1/8 Sargent & The W. Slaughter their co-trustees
and executors as the true debt; Lewis is recorded
for the other Executors to qualify hereafter; and without
will is recorded accordingly. Given under my
hand as clerk of said court this 19th of April 1821

 W. Anger her named Mary and her future increase to him and

 to him and his heirs forever also the feather bed my self with all
 the furniture of every description that belongs to
 6th I give and bequeath to my son Rowen Es. a negro woman
 named Celiza and her future increase to him and his heirs forever
 also the best bed and furniture that I own. 7th I give and
 bequeath to my two sons Roddy & Rowen Es. the farm I now live on with
 all the slaves together with all the best crop on hand and all the present
 crop growing of every description to them and their heirs forever also one
 horse named Ann and one mare named Dick two milk cows and
 Calves, also one large two horse plough, two horses and two of the best
 one horse plow cleaves & four wheels forward two of the best pair of
 steer yokes of oxen and cart and two chains seven of my best heavy
 hoes one large oven tled and ten galon Kettle and one pair of hoes
 also all the provision laid in for consumption and ware of every
 description in my smoke house or meat house also a pair of iron axes
 also one grubbing hoe and two of the best killing hoes also my clock
 Secular and Dining Table also my best cotton wheel and flax
 wheel, all my spun yarn and all my flax & wool also half a
 dozen of my best chairs also one dozen plates half a dozen Teacups &
 Saucers one half dozen best Knives and forks and half dozen German
 Silver Table Spoons and one set of Tea Spoons
 8th I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend James Right
 far deen for my two sons Roddy and Rowen Es. Executors
 Control and Care of their persons and property, in 9th I give
 and bequeath to my son Edwin Es. the same above show
 decreed to be paid over to him and what money here after due to
 be paid them to him and his heirs forever. 10th
 All the rest of my estate both real and personal of what
 nature or kind soever it may not be herein particularly disposed of
 I desire may be equally divided amongst my sons, Edwin Es
 Francis Dudley and William Frazer to them and their
 heirs forever. And Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint
 my friend James Right and my son Edwin Es. Executors of
 the my last will and testament hereby revoking all other former
