and David Williams appraisers of my estate

10th It is my desire that at my death all my debts that have not discharge of shall
be valued by the appraisers I have selected & discharged and divided equally among
all my Children &c. Anthony Condit, Mary Acton, Samuel B. Condit, Sally
B. Condit, Richard C. Condit, James W. Condit and James Dr. Condit by giving
them draw bills for they are valued and listed off

11th I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Samuel B. Condit guardian of my
son James Dr. Condit to receive & take care of him & his portion of my estate

12th At the death of my wife I wish all my landed estate together with the slaves
(and with the increase of the slaves) that is bequest to her to be equally divided among
all my Children herein before mentioned & to be valued by the appraisers I have named
and the said division for by the Children as before mentioned, I desire I wish
it to be laid off in Town lots as about seven acres each, to be contain quantity
proportion to quantity and drawn for by the Children the same as the slaves or

13th It is my desire that in case my friends whom I have appointed as my appraisers
should fail to act or any one of them, by refusal, death or otherwise I wish the
County Court to appoint others in their place who will carry out my wishes

14 All the rest & residue of my estate of what ever kind it may be not here before
specified, I desire shall be equally divided among all my Children herein
before mentioned

15th And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my son Thomas with my friend
J. G. Wright my executor of this my last will & testament, fully revoking all others
I wish that I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this
25th day of April 1846

testament as follows: I do hereby bequeath and devise all my real estate, both
land and tenements, and the sum of ten hundred dollars, to be paid to my
son Edmund Child, named by the name of Chas. Foley, and I desire that he
shall have and take the same upon the redemption of the said debt, or may be
appropriated in such manner as they may think wise and good. I do hereby give and
grant unto my said son Edmund Child the sum of ten hundred dollars to be paid to
him at the age of twenty one I then desire that the said debt be paid, and that he
redeem from bondage my daughter in law Susan Child, and that she be left and
left her to purchase Rebekah my sister Guppy, and with the sum of the death of my wife before
mentioned I request my trustee, Chas. to my daughter whatever may be in their hands, after
her redemption and I do hereby constitute and appoint the said Edmund Child and
James Condit my executor of this my last will and testament and declare the County Court of
Franklin to grand Jurors, testimony without their seal and signature as Witness my hand and
seal this 17th day of June 1833.
