- Item 1st This is my will and I desire that my executor hereafter named pay to wit to S. Church the husband of Catherine (the said) the land of the said as his full share among estate
- Item 2nd I do hereby bequeath and give to the said S. Church one third of all the property now by me owned and consisting of land negroes or any other whatsoever to him and his heirs forever
- Item 3rd This is my will and desire and I do hereby bequeath unto my brother John C. Brown one third of all my estate of every description whatsoever to him and his heirs forever
- Item 4th This is my will and desire and I do hereby bequeath unto my nephew John Church one tenth of all my estate to him his heirs forever
- Item 5th It is my will and desire that the remaining eighth part be equally divided amongst the said S. Church, John C. Brown and John Church to have their heirs forever
- And lastly I hereby appoint the said John Church executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills and testaments by me here before made
