 to dispose of the same in such manner and to such persons as she may
 think proper
 Lastly I appoint my son James Todd Harris as my wife Anne's
 Executor and executrix of this my last will and testament - hereby revoking all
 other Wills by me made & I do hereby certify this my last will and testament

 of John Harris (as it was produced in court) and the body thereof known to be
 the last will of John McHenry Jr one of the subscribing witnesses by the oath of
 John C. Williams, Philip Leachery and J. L. Whittington who are sworn the signature
 of said McHenry whose name is subscribed as a witness thereto and from the
 death of said McHenry - Paul Leachery, Whittington and J. L. Whittington
 and J. L. Whittington subscribed their names and took with them separate the like
 the said Leachery also proved the signature of John Harris the testator
 It is therefore ordered that the said instruments be admitted to record as the
 last will and testament of John Harris and that such certified copies be made
 in my office

Franklin County 17th March 1825. I William B. Hawkins being of
 sound mind and disposing memory do make this instrument my last will and
 testament in manner and form following that is to say I do bequeath to my
 wife Mary Hawkins the farm on which I now reside with all the appurtenances
 thereto belong of house hold and kitchen furniture and the negroes that I own
 and my horse, Cattle and sheep farm implements and four horses which I do my
 choice from during the term of her natural life and after her decease
 I give the farm to my son J. F. Hawkins to be enjoyed by him forever and
 the personal property I wish to be divided equally amongst all my children
 herein after mentioned, (ex. adm. J. F. Hawkins) viz. Mary Hawkins, Rebecca
 Wright, Martha Child, A. C. Hawkins, E. O. Hawkins, W. C. Hawkins, James
 Farmer, Sarah McLee and the Son of Elizabeth Wright, and to my father

My will and desire that on the decease of my wife Mary Hawkins that her portion
 of the young negroes to my son James F. Hawkins or her heirs to be paid to my daughter Mary
 Rebecca Wright Martha Child and Sarah McLee in equal shares - If my
 dear child the son on which I have spent of John Black was made the same
 equally amongst all my children herein before mentioned and the children of Elizabeth
 Wright (ex. adm. J. F. Hawkins) either by selling and sending the money or by laying the
 land off in lots as my best suit shall be for the rest and residue of my estate that
 there be any thing not specifically to be equally divided amongst all my children
 mentioned This is further my wish and desire that my son James F. Hawkins live with
 his mother as long as she may live, and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my
 friends John F. Farmer James F. Wright and my wife Mary Hawkins and my son James
 F. Hawkins executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other former
 Wills or testament by me heretofore made. Witness my hand and seal this day and date above written

 deceased being as it is the 17th March 1825 was this day produced in court by Mary Hawkins,
 widow of the said William B. Hawkins decd. - J. F. Hawkins, W. C. Hawkins, William
 C. Hawkins, Wm B. Hawkins, James F. Wright, James F. Farmer, J. F. Hawkins, E. O. Hawkins,
 decision of the said William B. Hawkins by her counsel appeared in court and offered
 the proof of said will. The execution thereof witnesses were sworn and examined and the
 will offered for proof within the time of the last will and testament of the said William B. Hawkins
 and the same with my fully certified copy is given under my hand

 to be the last will and testament of William B. Hawkins bearing date on the 17th day of
 March 1825 is the true last will and testament of the said deceased, wherefore it is ordered
 that the said writing be admitted to be read as such last will & testament, whereupon the same
 is duly recorded in my office

 In the name of God Amen I William C. Hawkins being of sound mind and
 disposing memory do make this my last will and testament
 1st That my will, that my beloved wife Mary C. Hawkins shall have the sole and
 property of every kind she may possess for the support of herself and my children -
 2d That my will that all of my property shall be equally divided among my sons
 William C. Hawkins and Samuel B. Hawkins and that my wife may dispose of the same
 the same as she shall see proper and that my wife may dispose of the same as she
 may see proper for the accomplishment of that object
