8th I wish that my youngest son James Dr. have a good boy or two or three  
to be raised & educated and I therefore give him the right to choose either one Lewis  
from the Sign of Red Hammer

9th I hereby constitute and appoint my friends Samuel P. Coffey, William Hall  
and David Williams appraisers of my estate

10th It is my desire that at my death all my slaves that have not disposed of shall  
be valued by the appraisers I have selected & sold and divided equally among  
all my children &c. Anthony Comstock, Mary Acton, Samuel P. Coffey, Sally  
P. Comstock, Richard C. Comstock, James W. Comstock and James Dr. Comstock by giving  
them draw bills for they are valued and listed off

11th I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Samuel P. Comstock guardian of my  
son James Dr. Comstock to receive & take care of him & his portion of my estate

12th At the death of my wife I wish all my landed estate together with the slaves  
(and with the increase of the slaves) that is bequeathed to her to be equally divided among  
all my children herein before mentioned & to be valued by the appraisers I have named  
and the said division for by the children as before mentioned, I desire I wish  
it to be laid off in Town lots as about seven acres each, with to contain quantity  
of rocks to quantity and drawn for by the children the same as the slaves or

13th It is my desire that in case my friends whom I have appointed as my appraisers  
should fail to act or any one of them, by refusal death or otherwise I wish the  
County Court to appoint others in their place who will carry out my wishes

14 All the rest & residue of my estate of what ever kind it may be not here before  
specified, I desire shall be equally divided among all my children  
as before mentioned

15th And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my son Thomas with my friend  
J. G. Wright my executor of this my last will & testament, fully revoking all others  
I do hereby witness I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this  
25th day of April 1846

I Chas. Poley of the town of Hampton, do make and declare my last will and testament  
I give and bequeath all my real estate, Real personal and mixed estate, to my son  
and father Joseph and to the survivors in trust for the purpose of maintaining my son  
son Edmund Child, named by the name of Joseph Child, and should have been  
fallen and in the hands of the said trustee upon the redemption is effected I wish it may be  
appropriated in such manner as they may think wise & convenient for the support of my said  
grandson and in case my said grandson should die before he is thus educated same to be by  
arrangement to the age of twenty one I then desire that the said Joseph Child, with his son and  
redeem from bondage my daughter in law Susan Child, and should have to sell and dispose  
left then to purchase Rebekah my sister Guppy and with the sum of the death of my sister before  
her death I request my trustee, Chas. Poley to my daughter whatever may be in their hands, after  
her redemption and I hereby constitute and appoint the said Edmund Taylor and  
Jacob Loring my executors of this my last will and testament and declare the County Court of  
Franklin to grand Jurors, testimony without their seal and bond as witness my hand and  
seal this 17th day of June 1833.
