In addition to which has already been charged to John to be charged with two hundred dollars by Gift Ford of my money. - I leave one girl named Mary two hundred dollars also one girl named Ann at three hundred dollars, and no children. - Benton one hundred and twenty three dollars, children also eight hundred and ninety dollars by me. Edward one hundred and fifty dollars, this is money that I gave to Gift Ford for Colman. - Gift Ford one boy named Henry at four hundred dollars, the above gifts are to stand as such my children, and for the balance of my estate after my death they are all to have an equal portion thereof.
