Repon my heirs of and which and being in the County of Richmond Kentucky One hundred and fifty the land in which I live and house of my said wife and children and in order that the same may be made available to aid in the raising and education of my said children and the support of my said wife - I hereby authorize and empower my Executor hereinafter named to make sale of said tract of land whenever my said wife may desire a sale thereof, and the proceeds of the sale to be used in other property or to be used in any other manner as my wife and my executor may think best for the use and benefit of my said wife and children

And I do hereby bequeath unto my said wife during her natural life the same and let her receive the same and when she shall have paid for the same and her debts and that my said children, the survivors of them at

the time of their death they die young children - I do also request that my executor with the Oaths of my said wife shall have power and authority to make and sell and convey said house and lot and the improvements thereon and the same shall be used in the same manner by my wife during her life and after her death by my children in the same manner as said house and lot is directed to be

That I will and direct unto my said wife during her life the same and all the rest & residue of my estate after the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses - Lastly I hereby constitute & appoint Robert C.
