5<sup>th</sup> I give and desire to my grandson John F Carter one hundred and fifty dollars - And to my grand daughter Lizzie A Carter three hundred dollars - to my daughter Sarah Ann Yancy fifty dollars and Thomas S Carters four children fifty dollars to each of them

6<sup>th</sup> Whatever I have advanced to my children I desire shall be charged to them in land or money. And the balance of my estate

left after paying the above legacies I direct to be divided among my children or the heirs of those dead they taking what their parents would be entitled to - Mary Barker is excepted out of this last devise as I have given her all I intend

I hereby appoint John A Carter & Wm V Spangler my Executors - I do hereby revoke all other and former wills by me made

2. I give to my son Richard Long one half dozen silver spoons, one milk cow, all the bacon on hand at my death, my mantle clock my lot of ground in the Frankfort Cemetery and all my estate of every description not herein specifically devised.

3. I give to my son Thomas Long one share of stock in the Bank

of Kentucky

4 I give to my daughter Elizabeth Moore one share of stock in the Bank of Kentucky

5 I give to my daughter Mary Hoopner one U S State bond of One hundred dollars

6 I give to my grand daughter Anna Long daughter of Richard Long one half dozen silver desert spoons, one bedstead and furniture, one hundred dollar U S Bond and one half of the money contained in a small tin box consisting of gold silver & paper the amount not recollected, something in the neighborhood of two hundred dollars be it more or less

7 I give to Elizabeth Long another grand daughter & daughter of Richard Long one silver Ladle one half dozen silver tea spoons one bedstead & furniture one hundred dollar U S Bond and the other half of the money contained in the tin box alluded to in the devise to her sister.

8 I give to my grand daughter Bathsheba base daughter of Nelson Hoopner one bedstead & furniture.

9 I give to Malissa Hoopner wife of James Hoopner one bedstead and furniture

10 I give to my grand daughter Mary Cammack one share of Kentucky Bank stock

11 I give to my sister Betsey Modley fifty dollars

12 I give to my grand daughter Anna Long daughter of my deceased son Samiel Long fifty dollars.

13 I give to my grand children Elizabeth & Thomas Long children of my deceased son William Long fifty dollars each

Lastly I hereby appoint my son Richard Long Executor of this my will desiring that no security be required of him upon his qualification as such
