6 I give to my grand daughter Anna Long daughter of Richard Long one half dozen silver desert spoons, one bedstead and furniture, one hundred dollar U S Bond and one half of the money contained in a small tin box consisting of gold silver & paper, the amount not recollected, something in the neighborhood of two hundred dollars be it more or less

7 I give to Elizabeth Long another grand daughter & daughter of Richard Long one silver Ladle one half dozen silver tea spoons one bedstead & furniture one hundred dollar U S Bond and the other half of the money contained in the tin box alluded to in the devise to her sister.

8 I give to my grand daughter Bathsheba base daughter of Nelson Hoopner one bedstead & furniture.

9 I give to Malissa Hoopner wife of James Hoopner one bedstead and furniture

10 I give to my grand daughter Mary Cammack one share of Kentucky Bank stock

11 I give to my sister Betsey Modley fifty dollars

12 I give to my grand daughter Anna Long daughter of my deceased son Samiel Long fifty dollars.

I. Mary S. Stannard of Frankfort in Kentucky, do make this my last will and testament, revoking all others heretofore made by me.
 1st I direct that my debts which I may owe at my death, be paid by my Executors as soon as possible.
 2^d I wish fifty dollars per year to be appropriated to keeping in good order, my lot and the grounds thereon, in the Frankfort City and I direct that an amount sufficient to produce this annual sum be placed in the hands of *J. W. Hunt Reynolds* as Trustee for this purpose, with power to appoint his successor in the trust and with like power in the successor from time to time.
 3^d It was the wish and special request of my husband, that my nephew and adopted son *J. W. Hunt Reynolds* should have all his books and that my niece and adopted daughter *Catherine G. Thome* should have all his pictures, and I hereby bequeath them accordingly - The said pictures being a kind of the *Senior Chocota* & *W. S. S. S. S.* two fruit pictures and a copy of one of *Raphael's* pictures.
 The rest of my pictures I wish disposed of according to a Memorandum which I shall have signed by myself the directions of which are also to be pursued, as to any other memorials or other personal effects.
 I give the silver spoons & table silver from my fathers estate and marked with his coat to my brother *Abner D. Hunt* as he has others of the same set.
 I give my bed room and dressing room furniture to my niece *Catherine G. Thome*.
 4th I devise my Bushing house on St. Clair street in Frankfort with the lot adjoining to it to my friend *Mrs. Maria G. Grund*
 5th I bequeath stocks or bonds of the value of Twenty five hundred Dollars out of such as shall belong to me at my death to *Mary Harriet Boddy*, daughter of *Charles S. Boddy* dec^d for life, to be held for her by a Trustee or Trustees appointed from time to time by my personal representatives with remainder after her death to be to *Edmond Burns*.
 6th I direct my Executors to set apart a fund sufficient to produce the net sum of six hundred Dollars which I bequeath and direct them to pay to my Cousin *John S. Sany*, daughter of the late *John S. Sany* who has lived. At her death the fund
