In the name of God, Amen: I, Burrell Bassett Sayre
 being somewhat afflicted & feeble in body but of sound mind
 do make and publish this as my last will and testament
 1st I will that all my just debts and reasonable funeral ex-
 penses be paid out of any money standing to my credit in the
 Banks at Frankfort

2nd I bequeath all my Mathematical instruments together with
 my gold watch to my grandson B. B. Sayre Rodman to be
 given to him by his aunt Elizabeth at suitable age.

3rd I bequeath my sorrel horse Tom Beeze should have
 come to my friend E. S. Theobald.

4th E. S. Theobald is authorized to pay debts and funeral ex-
 penses and settle with the Guardian of Elizabeth for the same

5th I desire that the Guardian & Trustees of Elizabeth herein
 appointed collect all notes due my estate at their maturity
 and deposit the amount to her credit in the Farmers Bank
 but the note of my brother William Sayre for four
 dollars is not to be used for during William's life

6th I will that all the balance of my property

kind shall remain in bulk where it is and as it is, so far
 as may be subject to the restrictions hereinafter made.

7th I devise & bequeath to my younger daughter Elizabeth
 an estate for life in one undivided half of all the said balance
 of my property & estate with remainder in fee in the undivided
 half to my elder daughter Virginia F. Rodman and the children
 of her body & to their heirs forever. But it is wished and earnestly
 desired by me that Virginia and family shall live at Point Bridge
 with Elizabeth free from all charge for board or rent, so long as cir-
 cumstances will permit and peace may be preserved between the
 parties. In the sad event of disunion or quarrel Virginia must
 retire & thence forward receive annually from her sister an
 amount of the revenues of the estate as Elizabeth can conscientiously
 spare from what is necessary to keep up the establishment at Point
 Bridge at least in the simple style & comfort that now exist
 8th I devise & bequeath to my said younger daughter Elizabeth
 in fee simple to be disposed of by her by last will & testament, in-
 fully as she may think proper one of the undivided half of said bal-
 ance of my property and estate. I grant from Leathes Farmers
 Bank of Kentucky to her an appointed Trustee & Guardian to my said younger
 daughter Elizabeth and he is to hold the title to all the property & estate
 here bequeathed & devised to my two daughters in trust for their use and
 benefit and the use and benefit of said property & estate is to be to the
 sole and separate use and benefit of each devisee respectively.

10th If said and aforesaid should at any time be deemed advisable
 to buy Bank Stock or other estate property above devised or bequeathed
 and it may be deemed by the said Trustee both of my said daughters
 in my aforesaid will or otherwise of the same in fee simple to be re-
 vested in said Trustee or estate the purchaser of that said thing that the proceeds
 be so re-vested in property with like limitations and restrictions
 so that said or any to be retained in that which may be sold to secure
 a just price & investment of the whole price. Written wholly in my
 own hand on four pages & a fourth of large letter paper & signed by me this
 16th day of September 1875.
