testament 1st I bequeath to my wife, Harriet Beasley
my house & lot on Blanton Street in the city of
Frankfort. 2nd I bequeath to my daughter Sarah
one \$1. dollar, to my daughter Martha Hobbs one \$1.
dollar, and to my daughter Lucinda five \$5. dollars
I direct that my quarry lot on Hobbes Street shall
be sold and the proceeds of said sale shall be applied
to the payment of my just debts and my funeral
expenses if there is any money left after paying
said debts and funeral expenses it shall be divided
equally between my wife and daughters

I Charles Fleming, of Christfield County,
being of sound mind and memory, do make, pub-
lish and ordain this my last Will and Testament.
After my just and legal debts lawfully paid I
will and devise the following distribution of all my
real and personal estate both in the State of Virginia
and of Kentucky, to wit: I give all my real estate
which law and is situated in the State of Kentucky
to my brother William Fleming and my two
nephews John Bernard Jr. and Richard Bernard
in trust to be sold for the benefit of my creditors
and to pay such legacies as shall be hereafter
directed. Which real estate consists of the follow-
ing tracts and parcels viz: One tract of land
lying in the County of Mason and situated on
the waters of the Ohio river containing eighty
thousand acres, also one other tract lying in
the same County and situated on the same
waters containing twenty thousand acres,
also one other tract in the same County
and containing sixteen thousand, one hun-
dred and twenty one acres, also one tract ly-
ing at the mouth of Glass Creek about four
miles from Frankfort, only one moiety of the
above tracts and parcels of land being mine
is all that -- give the aforesaid trustees for the
above mentioned purposes.

After my debts are discharged by the money
arising from the sale of my land by the
above mentioned trustees of the remainder or
residue of the money arising from the sale
of my land I give and bequeath one fifth
part to my two wives Mary Lewis and Char-
sanna Lewis, their heirs or assigns forever.

I give and bequeath to my brother
William Fleming, John Bernard, Junior and
Richard Bernard in trust for my sister Mary
Bernard, or for her surviving children, two
fifths of the aforesaid residue or remainder, to
them, their heirs or assigns forever, by which it
may be seen that the aforesaid two fifths shall be ap-
propriated by the said trustees for the support
and maintenance of my sister Mary Bernard
for her life, and after her death to be equally
divided among such of her children as shall

survive her or their representatives.
Item - I give and signeth the remaining two-fifths of the first mentioned residue to my brother William William Fleming, his heirs and assigns forever.

I appoint my brother William Fleming sole executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills.

It is my wish that after my death my estate shall be disposed of as follows to wit: First I direct that my debts of any and my funeral expenses be paid and that my Executor sell my certificate N^o 625 for four shares of stock in the Bank of Kentucky, and appropriate the proceeds or so much thereof as may be necessary to those purposes. Secondly I direct my Executor to have a substantial Stone wall built around my grand father Blackburns family grave yard in Woodford County and to have the graves and monuments therein repaired and put in good order, the whole not to cost exceeding One thousand dollars. Thirdly I give nephew W^m E. Hunt, and to my niece Lizzie H. Chimney, each one hundred dollars, to my brother James Blackburns children two hundred dollars to my niece Maria Hunt and to my great niece Hattie Elizabeth Rodman each fifty dollars and to my brother D. F. Blackburns daughter Elizabeth all the silver in Mathes Knoxs gives one, and to my sister Nancy Ann Havens daughter Elizabeth my diamond ring and fifty dollars. Fourth I request my husband, Dr W. J. Blackburn to live in the house we now occupy and use the lands I purchased of my sister F. B. Hunt during his natural life he to pay taxes and insurance. Fifth I give the remainder of my estate one fifth to my sister
