1st I desire on my dear child, to give

 chairs, one clock, pictures, and marble ornaments, 1 stool, one wash
 stand, one Basin, matting & carpeting, as so all the cooking
 utensils & all other things used & belonging to the kitchen, also the
 glassware & what else is contained in that sideboard.
 My wish is, to give to Liza Campbell, every thing else that is in
 this room (the room in which I am sick) & also, in the kitchen not named
 above.

3rd I give and bequeath unto John Triplett my two story brick
 house on the Turnpike opposite to the Pottery

4th I give to Mary Guerten, my one story brick house, lying on
 the pike, North of the house hereby given to John Triplett & next to the

1st I desire that the vacant ground lying from the one story
 brick house to Burns; also a lot lying on the turnpike opposite
 to Walkers & adjoining the property of Vesta Campbell and
 running westward to a fence that divides it from the two
 story brick house being 50 feet more or less on the pike and
 running back northward about 150 feet more or less to a
 fence - all these lots to be sold and the proceeds applied
 to the payment of my debts (my funeral expenses to be first
 paid) should there be any more I desire that Mrs. Ford
 shall give to Lydia Ann Harriett and Caddy, a dress a piece
 & if any is left, I wish Mrs. Ford to have it.

2nd I also desire that the ground on which the brick
 house, given to Triplett & the one story house given to Mary
 Guerten (after the vacant lots are laid off & sold, as named
 above) shall be equally & equitably divided between the said
 two houses as given to Triplett & Mary Guerten.

3rd I also desire & hereby appoint my friend Lyander Ford
 as my Executor, to see that this my Will is carried out and
 properly executed.
