7th All the rest and residue of my property of whatever kind I desire shall be equally divided between all my children.

8th Lastly I hereby appoint my son Isaac Wingate Jr. and my son-in-law B. B. Quinn Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other or former wills by me made. Done this 4th day of April 1874.
