I Charlotte Letcher of the City of Frankfort and State of
 Kentucky do make and publish and ordain this to be my last
 will and testament hereby revoking all former wills made by
 me. It is my will that my Executors shall pay all my
 just debts and funeral expenses at the expense of my State
 cause suitable head and foot stones to mark my grave with
 the inscription whitt Charlotte Letcher wife of Robert D.
 Letcher and nothing more. I give and devise to my former
 colored servants Ellen McKee five hundred dollars to Ann
 Letcher four hundred dollars. If either or both should die be-
 fore to come in possession of the above legacies then it is to revert
 back to the estate - these legacies to be paid in preference to all
 others. I The estate which a beneficent providence has placed
 at my disposal is insufficient to make complete provision
 for any number of my many beloved relations, but for reasons
 which appear to be sufficient, I make the following devises or
 small tokens of my affection for some of them viz. I give
 to the four youngest children of my deceased niece Jane L. Dungan
 eight hundred dollars to be equally divided between them. I give
 to my niece Margaret Bradley wife of William O. Bradley
 a ring, brooch and a pair of earrings of gold and silver. I give
 to my niece Susan Woodman a pair of hair salts and
 a pair of gloves and a pair of gloves of my mother. I give to
 my niece Lettie five or six of maroon ribe two hundred dollars
 the box of Continental Cigarettes, a ring and pin. I give to Charlotte
 Loomis the wife of Zachary M. Loomis five hundred dollars and
 the portrait of her self and her silver table half dozen and
 half dozen of spoons and a pair of silver waiter. I give to
 Maria the wife of John Thompson one silver pitcher and
 a pair of gold plates the picture that sets on my room and
 a few small pictures that hang over it. I give to Dr. Alexander
 McKee five hundred dollars and his wife Mary McKee my
 silver soap tulle and my silver tea set and three small pictures
 with gilt frames hanging in the parlor. I give to George McKee
 four hundred dollars in furniture my glass and Mexican or-
 naments. I give to Joseph P. Letcher four hundred dollars one side
 board that sets in my dressing room. I give to Maria L. Bradley
 my husbands portrait painted by Guett. I give to Charlotte Bell
 wife of David Bell five hundred dollars. I give to my niece
 Charlotte Edg wife of Dr. Wm. M. Edg five hundred dollars
 to Charlotte Le Walcott daughter of Col. Alex. R. McKee
 one hundred dollars to Margaret L. Hardie daughter of
 Harry Hardie two hundred dollars to the two youngest chil-
 dren of my deceased nephew Dr. Robert P. Letcher two hundred
 dollars each to my niece Margaret Bufort wife of
 Dr. Bufort two hundred dollars to my niece

Wife of James Mcemury two hundred dollars should she
 before the legacy is received then I give the same to her
 or the survivor to my niece Ellen Todd wife of Dr. Todd one
 hundred dollars. To my niece Margaret Carter one hundred dollars I give to
 my nephew Geo. A. Robertson one hundred dollars and to his wife
 H. Robertson all my household and kitchen furniture, all that
 does not want, no coal mill give to Ellen and Ann my former
 wants. To my niece Margaret Bowdoin wife of Dr. Wm. Bowdoin
 one hundred dollars. To my niece Jane N. Keizer widow of Col. Wm. Keizer
 three hundred dollars. I give to Anne Robertson wife of James
 Robertson five hundred dollars. To Alexander H. Robertson
 two hundred dollars. 7th I devise to the Elders and deacons of the
 Presbyterian Church of which I am a member the sum of
 three hundred dollars to be used by them in support of the gospel
 in said Church. To the minister that may preach my funeral
 one hundred dollars I give to the wife and support of Alexander
 H. Keizer & Geo. A. Robertson of this my last will and testa-
 ment and in case of the death or refusal to accept or resignation of either
 of them as a qualification the other shall have full power to carry
 all the provisions of this will and they are empowered to sub-
 convey any real estate or other thing belonging to me privately or pub-
 licly in such manner as may seem to them best. If there may
 be any residue of my estate after payment of debts legacies &c. to be
 made and a portion of same is to be given to my wife that such residue
 shall be distributed among the several legatees herein named
 equally. I give the full legal control of my deceased husband's
 estate to be placed in the hands of his representatives or private
 Chamber in witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my signature
 this 30th day of October 1879
