I Austin P Cox of Frankfort Ky make my last will & testament as follows To wit
First - I give & devise to my son Wm E Cox the whole of my estate of every character and description in trust for the payment of all my just debts & funeral expenses and the support & education of my son Philip Mason Cox whom I desire to receive from my estate as good an education as my son the sd Williams E Cox has already received - And among my debts I include a debt of four hundred dollars with interest from the 1st day of May 1861 which I owe to the sd Wm E Cox for borrowed money. For the purpose of paying all of said debts & funeral expenses and educating & supporting the said Philip Mason as is before directed the said Williams E Cox is hereby ~~vested~~ vested with full power & authority to sell & convey any part of my estate
Second - After the payment of all my debts & funeral expenses and providing for the support & education of the said Philip Mason as is before directed I hereby bequeath and devise to my son the said Williams E Cox all the balance & residue of my estate of every character & description whatsoever with full power & authority in him to dispose of the same as in his judgment & discretion he may think proper without interference from or control by any of my children, he having the discretion to give to any one or more of said children any part of said estate or its proceeds as in his discretion he may think proper.
Lastly I hereby appoint my son the said Wm E Cox the executor of this my last will & testament hereby revoking all former wills by me heretofore made. It is also further hereby directed that said Williams shall not be required to give security as Executor of this last will & testament.

Know all men by these presents that I Harnett A Burnham of the County of Franklin in the State of Kentucky considering the uncertainty of life & being in full possession of sound mind & memory do make declare & publish this my last will & testament, not unbiased, uninfluenced by the opinion of any one - revoking one made in favor of E C Burnham & Arthur L Kinney which after due due deliberation I declare to be null & void
I give and bequeath to my maternal uncle Leroy Woodridge as a testimony of benefits received from him all the remaining land held in my right as specified in the deed made over to me by Geo C Kinney & his wife & recorded in the Circuit Court office in Joliet Will County in the State of Illinois, said land having been subdivided into four parts & two of them already sold
I give & bequeath all money left of my possession after my burial expenses to be divided equally among Mary Jane Leonora & Josephine daughters of said Leroy Woodridge. - I give & bequeath to my brother E C Burnham my mothers silver spoons or a larger & small, should he die without heir said spoons I give & bequeath to his sister Mrs G C Kinney together with my mothers ear rings & the miniature pin of my father. Should Mrs Kinney die without jointure heirs I give & bequeath said pin & ear rings to my much esteemed aunt Emily Woodridge. The balance of my personal effects I will dispose of personally I will & bequeath my gold watch to Fanny H Woodridge to be left in the hands of Leonora Woodridge until Fannie arrives at the age of 16 years.
