I Lawrence Gordon, of the County of Franklin and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory and calling to mind the Certainty of death and the uncertainty of life do make this my last will and testament in words following (To wit): After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses is paid, I desire that the balance of my estate be divided between my children as follows:

1<sup>st</sup> I give and bequeath to my Daughter, Mary Ann during her natural life, and after her death to her children, the following boundary of land, To wit: Beginning at a Walnut original corner of my 300 acre Survey, thence S. 70. W. 60 poles to a poplar, thence S. 60. W. 59 poles to a bush, corner to Wm. Doan's, thence N. 18. W. 38 1/2 poles to a Slave corner, to said Doan's, thence West 7 poles to a stone, thence N. 7 E. 12 poles to a Stone, thence N. 63 E. 38 poles to a stone, thence North 54 poles to a poplar, dogwood and ironwood, corner to Susanah Hughes, thence East 70 poles to a bush and small stone, thence South 20 poles to the beginning.

2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath to my Daughter, Susanah Hughes during her natural life, and after her death to her children, the following boundary of land situate and being in the County of Franklin on the waters of Six Mile Creek and bounded as follows (To wit): Beginning at a Stone bush in Harrison's line, thence South 70 poles to a bush and small oak corner to Wm. Doan, thence West 108 poles to a poplar, dogwood & ironwood,

thence North 90 poles to a white oak and black gum, thence East 108 poles to the beginning.  
3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my Son, Lawrence Gordon, the following boundary of land situate and being in the County of Franklin on the waters of Six Mile Creek, and bounded as follows (To wit): Beginning at S. White oak corner to Harry Lane, thence East 134 poles to a white oak and black gum, thence South 90 poles to a Stone, thence East 14 poles to a poplar, dogwood and ironwood, thence S. 54 poles to a planted Stone, thence thence S. 63 W. 38 poles to a Stone, thence S. 7 E. 12 poles to a Stone, thence S. 79 W. 10 poles to a stone, thence N. 7 W. 14 poles to a Stone, thence S. 80 W. 30 poles, S. 50 W. 31 poles, N. 81 E. 33 poles, to a red oak corner to Wm. Doan's, and Dran Lane, thence with a line of Dran Lane and Samuel Reeves to the beginning.

4<sup>th</sup> Having heretofore given my Son, Dennis Gordon, his portion of land I desire after my death that all my estate, not above specified be equally divided between Dennis Gordon, Mary Ann, Susanah Hughes, and Lawrence Gordon.

5<sup>th</sup> & Lastly I do hereby appoint Dennis Gordon Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other or former wills or Testaments by me heretofore made.
