2<sup>d</sup> It is my will that my funeral expenses & my just debts be paid  
 out of my undivided estate

3<sup>d</sup> I will & bequeath unto Frances Hutton the wife of my son  
 Lewellyn Hutton and to their children the tract of land upon  
 which my said son Lewellyn & his family now lives, containing  
 originally about two hundred acres but from which have been  
 sold thirty one acres, the proceeds of which sale have gone for  
 the benefit of my said son Lewellyn. But it is my will that my  
 said son shall have control of the above named tract of land  
 during his natural life.

4<sup>th</sup> I will & bequeath to my daughter Bettie Bowen and to her  
 son John the tract of land containing about two hundred &  
 sixty acres upon which D. N. Bowen the husband of my said  
 daughter now resides.

5<sup>th</sup> I will & bequeath unto my grand son William S. Hutton  
 the tract of land containing about two hundred & eighteen  
 acres upon which he now resides.

6<sup>th</sup> I will & bequeath unto my daughter Bettie Bowen what-  
 ever personal property I die possessed of on the tract of land  
 willed to her. Also whatever personal property I die possessed  
 of on the tract of land willed to my grand son William S.  
 Hutton I will to him.

7<sup>th</sup> I do hereby D. N. Bowen my son in law the Executor  
 of this my last will & testament -

I Peter Dudley of the county of Franklin & State of Kentucky do  
 make this my last will & testament.

First I direct that my just debts be paid. Second, I give to my  
 beloved wife Maria S. Dudley my entire estate of every description  
 real personal & mixed for & during the term of her natural life  
 and at her death I give the house & lot on which I live in  
 Frankfort to John B. Lindsey in trust for the sole & separate use  
 of his wife Ellen Maria Lindsey & her children, hereby au-  
 thorizing & empowering the said John B. Lindsey trustee as  
 aforesaid to sell & convey the said house & lot with the consent  
 of approval of his said wife and to reinvest the proceeds of  
 such sale on other productive property or securities for the  
 same uses & trusts. I also give to John B. Lindsey for the same  
 uses & trust twenty five shares of stock in the Northern Bank  
 of Kentucky with similar power of disposition & reinvestment.

My farm in Franklin County I direct to be sold at my wife's  
 death or at any time during her life when she may wish it.

In the latter event I desire that the proceeds of the sale shall  
 be invested in some safe & productive security during my wife's life  
 and the income thereof to be paid to her as it accrues. At

her death I wish the proceeds of the sale of the farm to be divided  
 into eight shares, of which one shall be given to John B. Lindsey in  
 trust for his wife Ellen Maria Lindsey as above, two shares shall

be given to my grand nephew James Sarrard Dudley on trust for  
 the use of his wife & children and one share each to Margaret E.  
 D. Smith, Mary Menigo, William S. Dudley, Isham S. Dudley  
 and A. Theodore Dudley children of my nephew Ambrose W.

Dudley. I do not include my dear niece Maria S. Winston in  
 this disposition simply because I believe that she does not need  
 my assistance. Also at my wife's death I give ten shares of

stock in the Northern Bank of Kentucky to my nephew James  
 S. Dudley in trust for his son Peter Dudley, and ten shares of  
 the same stock to Eliza S. Smith daughter of D. A. & M. S. D.

Smith and ten shares of stock in the Bank of Kentucky to  
 each of my niece & nephew Dudley Talbot & Maria Dudley  
 children of William S. Talbot dec'd.

All my remaining estate  
 not specifically disposed of by this will I leave to be disposed  
 of by my wife at her own pleasure. I appoint my wife

Maria S. Dudley and my nephew Ambrose W. Dudley  
 my Executors of this my last will and direct that no  
 be required of either of them. And I give full
