2. It is as by my invitation that my grand daughter Ellen reme came after her marriage to live with me and I will & desire that no charge be made against her or her family for board during my life

I hereby appoint my friend James M Lancaster the Executor of this my last will with the right to appoint another provided he cannot act -

Being warned by my physician that the disease of the heart under which I am suffering is likely to increase and being perfectly sound in mind and desirous of disposing of my entire estate in a different manner from the provisions of our laws I make this my last will & testament

1st I give to my wife Rosanna M Yates my entire estate consisting of land, stock of all sorts, furniture, notes & accounts money & indeed every thing I possess to do with as she pleases without aid of administration of my effects or an executor of my will (If any such person is legally required I want her constituted as such) except the sum of five hundred dollars to be realized from my land or other property to be given my wife's name Susan Young Major daughter of Dr Hoerman Major of Letcher County Mo

The sole object of making this will I repeat is with exception above bequest to give my wife every thing I possess and also to give her control & choice of how & when the five hundred dollars for Susan Young Major shall be raised & paid
