- 1 I desire that all my just debts be promptly paid
- 2 I give and bequeath to Bridget W Gowan my cousin
five hundred dollars to be paid to her by my Executors
as soon after my death as is convenient
- 3 I devise to my mother Mary Mullen all the rest and
residue of my property and estate of every description for
and during her natural life
- 4 After the death of my mother it is my desire that
my executors shall take possession of said estate so due
to her for her lifetime and that they have my farm and
terrace using my slaves thereon and that they make
said estate as profitable as possible up to the time
that the youngest of my nephews & nieces viz the child

of my sister Mary Ann Carr & Lucy Lillis arrives at the
age of twenty one years. My executors are directed to pay moneys
to such of the children of my two said sisters as they think
proper such part of the profits arising from my estate after
my mother's death as they shall have in their hands charging
each of them with what they receive. When the young-
est of said children of my sisters arrive at 21 years of age
my Executors shall sell all my said estate (Should my
mother be then dead) and when the proceeds thereof have
been collected my Executors are directed to make division
thereof between all of said children equally charging
therewith those who have received any of said profits
the object being to make them all equal

I do hereby appoint my friends Wm Knight and
J P Wellbans my Executors and they well carry
this will into effect. I desire that they nor either of
them shall not be required to give security as execu-
tors in the Franklin County Court

Item 6th I wish my cupboard ware equally divided between my brother Joshua Flood & Nathaniel Flood

Item 7th I have two barrels flour at John Chidlers which I bequeath to Nathaniel Flood

Item 8th I bequeath to Joshua Flood what sugar & coffee that may remain on hand after my death

Item 9th I wish the negroes to be hired out until they can be divided as above specified and the proceeds reserved for my said three sons previously named until such time as they can be divided, then to be divided as previously specified in 3rd Item

Item 10th I wish Nathaniel Flood to take charge of all of my property of every kind not previously specified & disposed of by this instrument and take care of it until my three sons can have a chance to divide it equally among them

Item 11th I wish Nathaniel Flood to act as executor to this my last will & testament and see that its provisions are carried into effect.

I give and bequeath to my two daughters Mary & Ruth each four hundred dollars to be used for their education only, that is I direct my Executor hereafter named to invest the said amount in Government or State Bonds if she deems it best to do so; if not, to use it to the greatest advantage for their schooling & clothing.

My debts of any I wish first paid out of any money in the hands of my wife.

I hereby constitute & appoint my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth my Executor of this my last will & testament and that no security shall be required of her by the Court. In testimony whereof I here by set my hand & seal this 7th day of April 1865 in the County of Franklin & State of Kentucky
