all of my parlour furniture, Twelve Silver forks and
Silver Soup ladle: The portrait paintings of my
Father and Mother I give to Ambrose W. Ludley for a
remembrance and for his children...
Fifth: I give to Helen and Maria Lindsey daughters
of my Grand Niece Helen M. Lindsey my private bed
room furniture
Sixth: I desire that Mary Aldridge my Grand Niece
shall as she may elect give some Article of the
possessions of my house to each Panny America and
Betty who formerly served me as a remembrance
Seventh: I give to Helen M. Lindsey as promised the
painted portraits of myself and my late husband
Eight: I give the remainder of personal Estate and
effects to my Grand Niece Mary Aldridge to be disposed
of as she may elect to do and as I may advise her
verbally.

I appoint James G. Ludley my Grand Nephew my
Executor of this my last Will and direct that no security
be required of him, and give him full power and
authority to carry out the purposes of this Will

I Mathew Sullivan of the County of Franklin and State of Kentucky, being feeble in body, but of sound mind and well knowing the uncertainty of life do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament.

First - I will that out of the proceeds of my estate to be disposed of as hereafter and herein provided, that all of my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid.

2nd I wish and will that my body be buried in the Catholic burying ground, at the Catholic Church in Scott County near the "white sulphur" and my executrix is hereby directed to have placed over me, a neat, plain marble, head and foot stone with my own name and that of my beloved wife thereon.

3rd I will that all of my estate both real and personal be sold, the personal on such time as my executor shall see fit. The real estate to be sold for one third of the purchase money in hand paid, one third due in twelve months, one third in two years from the day of sale. 4th - I will and bequeath to Mary Greenup, whom myself and my beloved wife has raised from a child, all the proceeds, in money or other things, of all my property, both real and personal and all my property, money or other things not mentioned in this my Will, subject to the conditions hereafter and herein mentioned.

5th - I will that the proceeds of my property heretofore mentioned, be held by my executor for the use and benefit of the said Mary Greenup until she arrives at the age of twenty one years. But if she should marry before she becomes twenty one years of age, in that event, if my said executor should be satisfied, that it would be right and proper for her best interest, then he shall turn over to her said money and proceeds of my property, my executor however to be at full liberty to use his own discretion, in the event of her marriage.

6th - I will that in the event of the death of the said Mary Greenup, before she shall become entitled to my estate as heretofore mentioned, then all said estate shall be and is hereby devised as the laws of the State of Kentucky direct in cases of descent and distribution.
