 4th It is my will that 10 one hundred dollars be given to my nephew Louis B. Mc Clellan living in Kansas
 5th The remainder after the farm is sold shall be equally divided between the Female Orphan School at Lexington and the Christian Bible College in Lexington Ky.
 6th And lastly I do nominate Washington brother son of Richard Crutcher and William Bailey son of Mrs. Bailey my sister or last as my executors of this my last will and testament and desire that this County Court will permit them to qualify as such without requiring of them security.
