 sold thirty one acres, the proceeds of which sale have gone for
 the benefit of my said son Lewellyn. But it is my will that my

 during his natural life.

4th I will & bequeath to my daughter Bettie Bowen and to her
 son John the tract of land containing about two hundred &
 sixty acres upon which D. N. Bowen the husband of my said
 daughter now resides.

5th I will & bequeath unto my grand son William S. Hutton
 the tract of land containing about two hundred & eighteen
 acres upon which he now resides.

6th I will & bequeath unto my daughter Bettie Bowen what-
 ever personal property I die possessed of on the tract of land
 willed to her. Also whatever personal property I die possessed
 of on the tract of land willed to my grand son William S.
 Hutton I will to him.

7th I do hereby D. N. Bowen my son in law the Executor

I Peter Dudley of the county of Franklin & State of Kentucky do
 make this my last will & testament.

First I direct that my just debts be paid. Second, I give to my
 beloved wife Maria S. Dudley my entire estate of every description
 real personal & mixed for & during the term of her natural life
 and at her death I give the house & lot on which I live in
 Frankfort to John B. Lindsey in trust for the sole & separate use
 of his wife Ellen Maria Lindsey & her children, hereby au-
 thorizing & empowering the said John B. Lindsey trustee as
 aforesaid to sell & convey the said house & lot with the consent
 of approval of his said wife and to reinvest the proceeds of
 such sale on other productive property or securities for the
 same uses & trusts. I also give to John B. Lindsey for the same
 uses & trust twenty five shares of stock in the Northern Bank
 of Kentucky with similar power of disposition & reinvestment.

My farm in Franklin County I direct to be sold at my wife's
 death or at any time during her life when she may wish it.

In the latter event I desire that the proceeds of the sale shall
 be invested in some safe & productive security during my wife's life
 and the income thereof to be paid to her as it accrues. At

her death I wish the proceeds of the sale of the farm to be divided
 into eight shares, of which one shall be given to John B. Lindsey in
 trust for his wife Ellen Maria Lindsey as above, two shares shall

be given to my grand nephew James Sarrard Dudley on trust for
 the use of his wife & children and one share each to Margaret E.
 D. Smith, Mary Menigo, William S. Dudley, Isham S. Dudley
 and A. Theodore Dudley children of my nephew Ambrose W.

Dudley. I do not include my dear niece Maria S. Winston in
 this disposition simply because I believe that she does not need
 my assistance. Also at my wife's death I give ten shares of

stock in the Northern Bank of Kentucky to my nephew James
 S. Dudley in trust for his son Peter Dudley, and ten shares of
 the same stock to Eliza S. Smith daughter of D. A. & M. S. D.

Smith and ten shares of stock in the Bank of Kentucky to
 each of my niece & nephew Dudley Talbot & Maria Dudley
 children of William S. Talbot dec'd.

All my remaining
 not specifically disposed of by this will I leave to be disposed
 of by my wife at her own pleasure. I appoint my wife

Maria S. Dudley and my nephew Ambrose W. Dudley
 my Executors of this my last will and direct that

no part of the same be required of either of them. And I give full

to carry out fully the purposes of this will and to make such deeds & conveyances as may be necessary to pass fully the title to any portion of my property which they or either of them act may sell in accordance with with my will.

In closing this paper I direct that five shares of Northern Bank stock be given to my friend Mrs Letitia Garrard widow of Col James Garrard dec^d as a testimonial of my gratitude for her kindness during my sickness.

In the name of God Amen - I John W Russell of Franklin County Kentucky being somewhat advanced in age and not in very good health but of sound mind and disposing memory do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all previous ones made by me - viz

1st I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid
2^d I devise to my beloved wife Ann Maria Russell in case she should survive me one equal third part in value of all my real estate for and during her natural life only, to be laid off by Commissioners appointed by the County Court as in cases of assignment of dower. And bequeath to her absolutely one equal third part of the net personalty of my estate.

3^d If I should die before my youngest daughter Ann Russell's education is completed it is my will and I hereby direct that her education shall be completed so that she will be equal in that regard with my other daughters and this to be done at the expense of my estate and not charged to her on the division hereinafter provided.

4th All the rest and residue of my estate I will and devise to be equally divided between my five children - viz
Gordelia J James, wife of Thomas James John Britton Russell, Margaret J Russell, Mary B Russell and Anna Russell.

5th That part of my estate devised and bequeathed to my daughter Gordelia J James the title thereto is vested in trustees viz W A James and H St Julian to hold the same for the sole and separate use of my said daughter free from any debt or liability of her husband but with power in the said trustees to sell exchange and reinvest the same as she by her writing over her own signature may direct and they approve. The said trustees not to be required to give any security for the performance of their trust.

6th I hereby appoint William A James Executor of this my last will and testament. Also Henry St Julian Executor of this my last will and testament and they are not to be required to give security for the performance of the duties herein required of them.
