5<sup>th</sup> I desire & bequeath to my niece Juliette Mc Samuels all other property of mine which I am possessed whether real personal or mixed  
6<sup>th</sup> I desire that Ambrose H. Doolley & W B Talbot shall be the Executor of this my last Will & Testament & having full confidence in their honesty capacity & integrity request that the County Court shall not demand security of them to which I have this day set my hand & affixed my seal this 10 day of February 1868

In the name of God Amen I Thomas S Doolley of Franklin County & State of Kentucky of discreet & sober body but of sound mind do make this my last Will & Testament And first I appoint Aaron B Doolley my executor & administrator and I want him to sell such property as he thinks can be best spared without coming into the house to satisfy all my just debts. And I want him to take my sons John B. William H. & Jason S Doolley and my wife Nancy Doolley to his home and raise & school the children with the rent of the farm if possible, and if the rent is not sufficient to raise & school the children & clothe them & my wife then he has power to sell the farm and appropriate the proceeds to that purpose until the youngest child becomes of age then if my wife remains a widow until then and there is any proceeds on hand then there shall be an equal division between all my children & my wife after a deduction of the horses I gave to Thomas & Frances one each but in the division I want James M Doolley to have a portion equal to Thomas & Frances both in the division and I want him to do as his judgment dictates with my half of the undivided lot of mine & the heirs of James Mc Lane dec - December the 8<sup>th</sup> 1868
