

Book wife my fine wearing apparel.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I bequeath to my negro women all my coarse cloth both summer & winter to be divided between them, also the coarse bed clothes to be divided between ~~them~~ my negro women in the same way as the coarse wearing apparel.

Item 6<sup>th</sup> I wish my cupboard ware equally divided between my brother Joshua Flood & Nathaniel Flood

Item 7<sup>th</sup> I have two barrels flour at John Chidlers which I bequeath to Nathaniel Flood

Item 8<sup>th</sup> I bequeath to Joshua Flood what sugar & coffee that may remain on hand after my death

Item 9<sup>th</sup> I wish the negroes to be hired out until they can be divided as above specified and the proceeds reserved for my said three sons previously named until such time as they can be divided, then to be divided as previously specified in 3<sup>rd</sup> Item

Item 10<sup>th</sup> I wish Nathaniel Flood to take charge of all of my property of every kind not previously specified & disposed of by this instrument and take care of it until my three sons can have a chance to divide it equally among them

Item 11<sup>th</sup> I wish Nathaniel Flood to act as executor to this my last will & testament and see that its provisions are carried into effect.

In the name of God Amen I Benjamin Onan being of sound mind & memory do make this my last will and testament to wit: I give to my wife Elizabeth Onan during her natural life (and at her death to my two infant daughters Mary & Ruth) a house & lot in the village of Consolation in the

County of Shelby and State of Ky now occupied by Alexander Roberts, also to have and enjoy during the same period my library and at her death to go to my daughter Mary and in case of Mary's death then to go to my daughter Ruth my set of silver cups (6). I desire to be given to my daughter Ruth and in the event of her death then to be given to Mary. All my personal property I give to my wife to be disposed of as she may desire or will. I give and bequeath to my two daughters Mary & Ruth each four hundred dollars to be used for their education only, that is I direct my Executor hereafter named to invest the said amount in Government or State Bonds if she deems it best to do so; if not, to use it to the greatest advantage for their schooling & clothing.

My debts of any I wish first paid out of any money in the hands of my wife.

I hereby constitute & appoint my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth my Executor of this my last will & testament and that no security shall be required of her by the Court. Be it remembered that I Robert Bollins of the County of Franklin and State of Kentucky being in good health and of sound mind & disposing memory but knowing the uncertainty of this life do make this my last will and testament as follows: Viz

1<sup>st</sup> I desire that my Executor hereafter named after my death pay all my just debts & funeral expenses.  
2<sup>d</sup> I give & bequeath to my daughter Sarah C Bollins all the improvements when I now live with the following boundary of land (Viz) Beginning at my South East corner and running with my line but not far enough that will make

the Stables and far enough North that an East line will include the orchard which line is to continue East to intersect mine & Blackmores line thence I with his and my line to the Beginning to her and her children forever. I also give to my daughter Sarah C. a negro woman named Lydia and her increase to her and her children forever. I also give my daughter Sarah C. my cupboard & cupboard furniture my Bed & furniture five dogs one gray horse and a cow & calf, my watch my family Bible and I leave my old negro woman Easter with her to take care of

3<sup>d</sup> I give to my son John One hundred dollars provided he behaves himself and treats me like a son should treat a father, but if he does not act right towards me he is not to have anything that is to be judged by my Executor hereinafter named.

4<sup>th</sup> I desire that all the real and residue of my estate both real & personal after my death be sold by my Executor hereinafter named and after paying my debts as above named out of the proceeds arising therefrom I desire the balance to be equally divided between my daughters viz Agnes Egbert, Mildred James, Elizabeth's children, Maranda Gorham Martha's children. I give the above legacy to my daughter (viz) Agnes, Mildred & Maranda to them and their children forever and my daughters Elizabeth & Martha's children are to have their mothers parts forever. I desire that my daughter Maranda shall have a horse or the value thereof as I never gave her a horse.

5<sup>th</sup> I do hereby constitute and appoint William Hall Anthony Crockett & James G. Wright to act as Commissioners to appraise my estate and have Sarah's land laid off as I have specified.

6<sup>th</sup> I do hereby appoint my friend S. B. Scofield my Executor to carry out my Will and here by authorizing him to sell the land make debts, sell the slaves, make any compromise that should be necessary and do just as I could myself. Sell the land and slaves on such time as he thinks best as well as terms.

7<sup>th</sup> I do hereby appoint my friend Jas G. Wright guardian for my grandchildren (viz) Elizabeth's & Martha's children to take care of their portions of my estate and apply it to their best interest

I John Burchfield of the County of Franklin and State of Kentucky being of sound mind & body do hereby make this my last will & testament hereby revoking all former wills made by me.

It is my will & desire that after my death my funeral expenses and just debts of any first be paid by my Executors hereinafter named. That my home farm with all the appurtenances thereto belonging of every description be owned and enjoyed by my wife Elizabeth Burchfield during her natural life and that after her death it may be sold by my Executors and the proceeds divided equally between my children. It is my will that after my death, my farm on which my son Henry now lives purchased by me from Philip Swigart son of Joseph Gore deceased be sold by my Executors and the proceeds of said sale with all the cash on hand shall be divided equally between all my children. I do hereby appoint my wife Elizabeth with my sons Henry & John Burchfield my Executors of this my will and that no security be required of them
