Commissioners and he one to whom shall fall that part of the
farms on which the house stands shall pay to my daughter Lucy

some Lillis and to my son Jacob the sum of fifty dollars each

4th I will and bequeath that my sons James and Merritt shall
pay to my sons George, William and John the sum of ten dollars
each when they my sons James and Merritt shall come into
possession of the farm

To my son in law James Carr and his children I have already
given their share of my estate.

I desire also that my sons James and Merritt have a care of
and assist my wife in the management and cultivation of
the farm, but if my wife chooses to employ any other person

she shall have the right.
