Major S. M. M. In the name of God Amen - I Samuel S. M. Major make and ordain this
writing to be my Last will and Testament -

First I will and devise that my Executors, make full and ample provision in every
regard for the Separate Maintenance of my wife Martha S. Major

Second I will and bequeath to my son John S. Major in trust for the Sole
use and benefit of my daughter Catherine M. Major and her issue that my share
her apportion of my estate equal in value to that which shall be distributed to each of
my Sons and a portion of the value of two thousand dollars in addition thereto, that
the share willed in trust for her benefit shall exceed in value the share of any one
by Two Thousand dollars, and in case my said daughter should die leaving no
Surviving her or in case said surviving issue should die intestate, then the portion
my daughter's estate willed in trust to John for my daughter's separate use
benefit, shall revert to my heirs general

Third I will and bequeath to my wife Martha S. Major in addition to and
and above her third or any provision for her during her life, the whole of the
share of my estate that would otherwise descend at my death to my son
John S. Major to be disposed of as she may deem proper, and if she shall die without
disposing of the same said share shall descend to my son Patrick or his heirs

Fourth I desire and hereby appoint my son Samuel S. M. Major for
Charles E. Tinsley my Executor. Witnessed March 15th 1855
