I Lawrence Gordon, of the County of Franklin and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory and calling to mind the Certainty of death and the uncertainty of life do make this my last will and testament in words following (To-wit): After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses is paid, I desire that the balance of my estate be divided between my children as follows:

1st I give and bequeath to my Daughter, Mary Ann during her natural life, and after her death to her children, the following boundary of land, To-wit: Beginning at a Walnut, original corner of my 300 acre Survey, thence S. 70. W. 60 poles to a poplar, thence S. 60. W. 59 poles to a bush, corner to Wm. Doan's, thence N. 18. W. 38. poles to a Slave corner, to said Doan's, thence West 7 poles to a stone, thence N. 7. E. 12 poles to a Stone, thence N. 63. E. 38 poles to a stone, thence North 54 poles to a poplar, dogwood and ironwood, corner to Susanah Hughes, thence East 76 poles to a bush and small stone, thence South 26 poles to the beginning.

2nd I give and bequeath to my Daughter, Susanah Hughes during her natural life, and after her death to her children, the following boundary of land situate and being in the County of Franklin on the waters of Six Mile Creek and bounded as follows (To-wit): Beginning at a Stone bush in Harrison's line, thence South 70 poles to a bush and small oak corner to Wm. Doan, thence West 108 poles to a poplar, dogwood and ironwood,

thence North 90 poles to a white oak and black gum, thence East 108 poles to the beginning.
3rd I give and bequeath to my Son, Lawrence Gordon, the following boundary of land situate and being in the County of Franklin on the waters of Six Mile Creek, and bounded as follows (To-wit): Beginning at S. White oak corner to Mary Lane, thence East 134 poles to a white oak and black gum, thence South 90 poles to a Stone, thence East 14 poles to a poplar, dogwood and ironwood, thence S. 54 poles to a planted Stone, thence thence S. 63. W. 38 poles to a Stone, thence S. 7. E. 12 poles to a Stone, thence S. 79. W. 10 poles to a stone, thence N. 7. W. 14 poles to a Stone, thence S. 80. W. 30 poles, S. 50. W. 31 poles, N. 81. E. 33 poles, to a red oak corner to Wm. Doan's, and Dran Lane, thence with a line of Dran Lane and Samuel Reeves to the beginning.

4th Having heretofore given my Son, Dennis Gordon, his portion of land I desire after my death that all my estate, not above specified be equally divided between Dennis Gordon, Mary Ann, Susanah Hughes, and Lawrence Gordon.

5th & Lastly I do hereby appoint Dennis Gordon Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made.

such as house hold and kitchen furniture, may be sold by my
Executor and the money arising from such sale to be paid over to
my brother John's deceased three Daughters, namely Sarah J. Seaman
and Mrs. M. Seaman and Elizabeth Seaman. It is also my
desire that my Executors shall sell my Buggy and Harness, and divide
the money equally between my brother John's deceased three Daughters
as above mentioned, my several legacies as above mentioned, I give to
them three heirs, executors or administrators and assigns forever.

And lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my friends Thomas
Barber and James B. Roberts my Executors of this my last will and
testament hereby revoking all other in former wills or testaments by
me made heretofore.

Knowing the Certainty of death and the uncertainty of life, I do
hereby make and publish this my last will
and testament revoking all other wills.

1st. I will and bequeath my spirit to God who gave it and my
body to a decent burial.

2nd. I will and bequeath to my son, Henry, all my personal
property, and to him I commit the care of my dear wife Mary Ann
during her life, and our daughter, Milvina, during her single state.

3rd. I have sold my farm to my Son-in-law, James W. Hughes,

4th. To my Son James I bequeath one hundred dollars in cash
in lieu of a horse and harness to be paid in the final distribution
over and above his distributable portion.

5th. To my daughter Milvina I will and bequeath one hundred
dollars in cash over and above her distributable portion, to be paid
in the final distribution of my estate.

6th. To my Son Henry I give and bequeath two hundred
dollars, as pay for attending to and settling up my estate as executor,
and he is herein appointed my executor, without security,
except a lien upon his portion received from my estate for a
faithful discharge of the duties I herein impose upon him.

7th. James W. Hughes is to give three land notes payable in one
two and three years from the 1st day of Dec. 1872, without
interest until due; these notes I wish my Son Henry to collect
when due, and use the money without interest to him as long as
my wife Mary Ann shall live, and at her death, or six months
thereafter it is my will and desire that this money collected
from the above land notes, be distributed as follows: "Sons"

8th. I wish all my just debts be paid, also the Doctor bills and
burial expenses of my dear wife Mary Ann, and then the several
divides of cash be paid to my son Henry and James and my
daughter, Milvina: And if at the death of my dear wife, my
daughter Milvina still remains single I wish six hundred dollars set apart
