 brick house to Burns; also a lot lying on the turnpike opposite

 running back northward about 150 feet more or less to a  
 fence - all these lots to be sold and the proceeds applied  
 to the payment of my debts (my funeral expenses to be first

 shall give to Lydia Ann Harriett and Liddy, a dress a piece

In the name of Almighty God by whom I hope to obtain everlasting life, I William S. Church of Franklin County Kentucky, having heretofore prepared a Will and being desirous to amend the same and make some changes that have seemed to me to be reasonable and just and being advanced in years, but of sound mind and disposing memory and desiring to make such disposition of my estate, as I believe to be proper and right, do hereby make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all other wills heretofore made by me in any manner and form following to-wit:

1. I desire that all of my just debts be paid, including my funeral expenses and the reasonable costs of administering my estate.
2. I desire that all debts and demands of every kind due me be collected by my executors hereinafter named as soon as practicable after my decease.
3. My executors hereinafter named are directed as soon after my decease as practicable to sell either at public or private sale and for the best prices that can reasonably be obtained therefor all the property both real and personal which I may own at the time of my death or such reasonable time and terms as my said executors may think proper, and in this way convert my whole estate into money, and in selling my real estate my executors may divide the land into such convenient shape and parcels as they may deem best and sell the same either in

parcels or sell the whole tracts together, whichever they may think best and my executors are authorized to make title to all of the said real estate when conveyed. When all of my debts are paid, and all debts due me collected, and all my estate converted into money as herein directed, I desire and direct my executors to dispose of the money which all of my estate may produce, as follows, viz:

4. To my daughter Emily Goram, wife of Wm J. Goram the sum of five hundred dollars and no more. The reason I give her no more is that I have mainly supported her and her husband for at least 20 years, and have also advanced money to said Wm J. Goram and paid debts for him, which have never been repaid to me, amounting in all to probably as much or more than I will have to give to each of my other children.
5. To my son John Robert Church I give three thousand dollars. (\$3000.)
6. To my daughter Sida Church I give four thousand dollars. (\$4000)
7. To my daughter Louisa Gridley I give two thousand dollars. (\$2000)
8. After paying to Emily Goram the \$500 and to John Robert Church \$3000 and to Sida Church \$4000 and to Louisa Gridley \$2000 then all the balance of the money which may arise from my estate shall be paid over to each and all of my children in equal proportions, excepting that my daughter Emily Goram shall not receive any thing more than the \$500 given to her by item 4 heretofore. It is my desire to make the gifts to my children all equal and this I have done by providing that those to whom I have already given largely shall receive no more until those who have received little or nothing are made equal to those who have already received portions of my estate; and the different amounts above given to each of my living children are intended by me to make all of them about equal sharers of my estate. The persons to whom I give my estate as herein provided, and in the proportions herein set forth are Emily Goram, Catharine Moore, Franklin Church, Louisa Gridley, Rebecca Peters, John Robert Church, and Sida Church, they being my only living children. Should any of them die before I do, then that part of my estate devised to such as may so die shall
