over & above one share and provided she marries for her share  
to go to her two children Sarah Belle Wilson and  
William Thomas Wilson

I also give devise & bequeath to Martha Frances Sneyd one  
hundred dollars over & above her equal share of her

right. I do nominate and appoint James R. Watson the trustee of Orpha Skipes children. I do nominate James R. Watson the sole executor of this my last Will & Testament. I furthermore declare that if there is one of my children not satisfied with this my will that he or her part shall be taken & divided in equal shares between the others.

To my son in law James Ear and his children I have already given their share of my estate.

I desire also that my sons James and Merritt have a care of and assist my wife in the management and cultivation of the farm but if my wife chooses to employ any other person

she shall have the right.
