I Jacob Polgrove of the county of Franklin & Commonwealth of Kentucky being weak of body but sound of mind and calling to mind the certainty of death and uncertainty of life do make this my last Will and Testament in words following to-wit

After my decease I desire all my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid out of any of my estate.

2nd After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses I will and bequeath to my two sons B. F. & J. S. Polgrove the farms on which I now reside to them and their heirs and assigns forever provided the said B. F. & J. S. Polgrove is to support my beloved wife Nancy Polgrove my daughter Mary Polgrove and my slave Jane during their natural lives.

3rd I will & bequeath to my said wife and daughter Mary Polgrove all my household and kitchen furniture during their natural lives and at their death I desire that the same may be sold and the money arising therefrom equally divided between my four children namely G. W. Polgrove Susan Wilson W. H. Polgrove and A. W. Polgrove I desire as soon after my decease as may be convenient that all my Stock and farming utensils be sold and the money arising therefrom be equally divided between my four children B. F. Polgrove Susan Wilson W. H. Polgrove and A. W. Polgrove

4th After the death of my wife Nancy Polgrove & daughter Mary Polgrove I desire that all my slaves be sold and the money arising therefrom be equally divided between my four children B. F. Polgrove Susan Wilson W. H. Polgrove and A. W. Polgrove

5th I desire that all my slaves remain with my wife & daughter Mary Polgrove during the lifetime of said wife & daughter provided my Executor herein after named them at to their advantage

7th I give to my son John Polgrove one dollar having hitherto gave him his portion of my estate and he is hereby released from all claims against him by me

Lastly I do hereby appoint my son W. H. Polgrove Executor of this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all other wills or testaments by me heretofore made

In the name of God Amen. I William Moore of the County of Franklin and State of Ky being weak in body but of sound & disposing mind - aware of the certainty of death and of the uncertainty of life do make this my last Will & Testament as follows to-wit

First I desire all my just debts to be paid in the best place
Secondly I will & bequeath unto my wife Jane Moore the farm on which I live and all the stock thereon and all other property whatever which I own to have & to hold use and enjoy during her natural life. Provided however that should she marry during her life then and in that case she shall (after marriage) have only one third part of the property herein before bequeathed to her and shall have that third part only for and during her natural life

Thirdly I will & bequeath to my son William Layton Moore all the property herein before bequeathed to my wife (during her life) to have and to hold the same after the death of my wife. But not until her death. I desired that my said son at the death of my wife pay to my daughters Elizabeth Gells and Letticia Corbin fifty dollars each

Fourthly Should my wife during her life and after my death again marry. It is my desire that the two thirds of the property herein before devised to her which she will thereby forfeit (by such marriage) shall thereupon belong to my said son Wm Moore forever

Fifthly I will to my daughter Mary Saylor one dollar
Sixthly I appoint my wife Jane Moore and my son William P. Moore my Executors to carry this my last Will into effect

3^d All the rest & residue of my estate real personal & mixed not herein before particularly disposed of I desire may be given to Mrs E Pastons children. and lastly I do hereby constitute John E Paston Executor of this my last will & testament hereby revoking all other or former wills & testaments

1st I wish all my just debts & funeral expenses paid
2^d I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Amanda all my estate of which I may own at the time of my death including lands debts owing to me & personal estate of every description upon the following conditions

3^d It is my will & desire that my wife shall take care of my grandson Glasgow and board and treat him well and if my wife should die before the sd Glasgow it is my will in this case that he shall have the one third of my estate but not have the possession of the property but shall be held by my Executor as a trustee for him and the income of the same to be paid him yearly but if the said Glasgow should die before my wife then she is to have the whole of my estate. Intended the following words to wit "upon the following condition" and "have the one third of my estate but" before signing I do hereby appoint my friends Fielding Tracy and Henry H Little Executors to this my last will & testament
