

I know all due by these presents, that I Nicholas
Prastor of the County of Gallatin and State of Montana
being sick and weak of body, but of sound mind and
disposing memory, do make this my last will and
Testament in manner and form following to-wit:

I will and bequeath to James Spraul Senr. of
the County and State of Iowa, all my personal
estate, and my share due in the Town of Fort
William, together with the parcel of ground there-
unto belonging, and on which said mill stands
(as more fully appears by appurtenance to William
Hayden bond to me for the conveyance of said
parcel of ground and mill on the said James
Spraul Senr. giving my body a decent burial and
paying to the said William Hayden the sum
of two hundred dollars and fifty cents, the amount
of my bond to said Hayden for the consideration
in part for the purchase of said mill and ground.

I do hereby appoint John Hancock of the County
and State of Pa. Executor of this my last will and
Testament. And I do hereby revoke all and every
former will or wills made by me, hereby ratifying
and confirming this as my last will and Testament.
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this 22nd day of March 1807.
