The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound John Davis Guardians of William Whitehead and Richard Whitehead Infant orphans of Richard Whitehead deceased his heirs Executors and Administrators, shall well and truly pay and deliver all such Estate as now is, or shall hereafter appear due to the said orphans, when they shall attain the lawful age to demand the same, or when thereto required by the Justices of the said Court for the time being. And also discharge his duty herein, in such manner as to save himself life and indemnify the said first above named

himself Justices and their successors from
all trouble and damage which may arise
about the said Estates, and in all things
faithfully to execute the duties of his office
according to law, thus this Obligation to be
void, or else in full force.

force and truly to be made to the said Justices and
their successors, we bind ourselves and every of
our heirs Executors and Administrators jointly
and severally firmly by these presents. Sealed
and dated this 22nd day of December 1806.

The condition of the above obligation is such
that if the above named John Whitehead Guardian
of George Whitehead, Infant orphan of
Richard Whitehead deceased, his heirs Executors
and Administrators, shall well and truly pay and
satisfy all such estate as now is or shall
hereafter accrue due to the said orphan John
he shall attain to lawful age to demand the
same or when thereto required by the Justices
of the said Court for the time being; And also
discharge his duty herein, in such a manner
as to save him self, and indemnify the said
