

This Indenture made this 2^d day
 of May 1801 between Alexander Cairns of the one part
 and John Adams of the other part both of Harard
 County and state of Kentucky witnesseth that the
 said Cairns for and in consideration of that said Adams
 hath this day undertaken for him as special
 Bail in this ~~sum~~ of debt brought against
 the said Cairns by William Woolly in Harard County of
 Quarterships and also for and in consideration of one Dollar
 to him the said Cairns in hand paid the receipt whereof he
 doth hereby acknowledge hath bargained and sold and by
 these presents doth bargain and sell to the said Adams
 A negro man named ~~ben~~ and a negro woman named
 Liddy and the said Cairns doth hereby covenant to and
 with the said Adams to warrant and defend the said
 Negroes to him the said Adams and his heirs forever from
 the claim of him the said Cairns and his heirs and
 from

from the claim of all other persons whatsoever provided
 however if the said Cairns shall completely indemnify
 and himself keep the said Adams from any cost
 trouble or damage which may or shall accrue
 to him from having become his the Cairns special
 bail of in the several actions of then the above bargain
 - or found sale to ~~the~~ Negroes to be void null and to
 have no effect In witness whereof I have hereunto
