

Frederick Hoffmann's Will

In the name of God Amen. I Frederick Hoffmann Junr of the County of Governor and State of Kentucky, being to some my mortality and that it is appointed unto man to die, and being in my perfect mind and memory, do make and Ordain this my last my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following to wit, I give unto my beloved Wife Mary Hoffmann, One Pair and a half of my Horse One Coat during his natural life time on Woodstock Also, It is my Will that she shall have my whole Land in her possession and enjoy the profit thereof during her said term of life or Widowhood. It is my desire after my Death that my Executors shall pay all my debts that is payable Except what I have given my Wife for her use) and give further Months Credit and that the Money arising from the sale be put on Interest, and at her Death the principal, Interest shall be Equally divided among my Children and Grand Children, that is to say, Henry Hoffmann, John Hoffmann Mary Cline, Elizabeth Cline, and Francis Cline. Hence, After the Death or Marriage of my Wife, I give unto my two Sons, Frederick Hoffmann and William Hoffmann

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My Son my Trust of Land, that is to say, 3 Acres and 25 perches that part on which I now live to the bottom which lies upon Backwash Run into the main Bottom and from the main Bottom to the Creek and to the River, unto William I give the other part. Hence, I do give to my Son William all the property I have left my Wife (after he Dies or a Marriage). I do appoint my Son Frederick Hoffmann and my Son in Law John Cline Executors of this my Last Will and Testament. as to my Wharf I have leave to let my Hand and Feet this 17th Day of March 1804

My Rachel Stapp Will

In the name of God Amen. I Rachel Stapp being in a lawful state of mind, but of perfect mind and of sound memory and calling to mind my worldly affairs make this my last Will and Testament; In the first place I resign my Body to the Ground, to be buried in a Christian like manner, and my soul to God who gave it. Secondly my Eighth part of my father's Estate, Real and personal, I wish to have Equally between my four Children to wit, William Stapp, my Son, Stapp Rachel Stapp and James Stapp. The last part I wish to be given to my Daughter Sally and Rachel but the price of said Part to be taken out of the said Sally and Rachel's parts. Thirdly, my Negro Woman Sally and her Child to be the two girls, and for their use until they attain to the age of twenty one years old or get married, fourthly I appoint the JURY of Governor County of Worcester to Execute & manage my affairs and wish no security.
