now in proper Health and in the full exercise of my
reason do declare this to be my last will and Testa-
ment. I now do give and bequeath unto my
son James that part of the plantation where
John Smith now lives so far as to a line that
was drawn between the said John Smith and
Daniel J. J. including the plantation where
Wharm Michael Southern now lives and also the
Mow that is called his, the above plantation
not to be delivered to him till he is twenty one
years of age. I now do give & bequeath unto

my son Edmund the balance of the above plan-
tation together with the dwelling house where
Joshua Davis now lives and to have half the spring
where Joshua Davis dips water out of the line
to continue as they are and also a mare that
is generally called his. I then I also will and
bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth the
plantation where John Todd now lives with
all its appertinences thereto the said place not
to be delivered to her till she is of twenty one
years of age and on the day of her marriage
one good horse and saddle worth twenty pounds
and also two cows and calves and the cott with its
increase that is now called hers. I then I will
and bequeath unto my son Henry the half of
the plantation where I now live with all the
houses thereto the dividing line to them through the
field where the old station formerly stood
and running to Samuel Scotts line.

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as will give two hundred acres of land on
both sides the said plantation not delivered unto
him till he is twenty one years of age and
also a horse saddle and bridle and a suit of
clothes the whole to be worth thirty pounds he is
to receive them when he is of age. I then I will and
bequeath unto my daughter Sally the other half of the pla-
ntation where I now live the part where W. Swinney
now lives on and also a horse and a suit of clothes when
she is sixteen years of age the above mentioned horse
and saddle and clothes to be worth thirty pounds.
I then I also will and bequeath to James and Edm-
und and Henry and Sally four Mill seats lying on
Dicks run in three locations and also fifty acres of land
Joining Samuel Preshaw the whole to be equally
divided amongst them its further to be observed that
the above mentioned legates shall not sell any part of
the above mentioned tract of lands or plantations with-
out the mutual consent of the whole. I then I do will and be-
queath unto my son William five hundred acres of land in
Mason County on the waters of Licking its being five hundred
acres out of a thousand acres survey

Item I do will and bequeath unto my two Daughters Nancy
and Pally eight hundred acres of land it being part of
two surveys lying in Mason County on Stone river creek
the said land to be equally divided between the two

I Item I will and bequeath unto Betsey Lfries a Daughter
to Daniel said Betsey Lfries one horse and saddle worth
fifteen pounds. Item that I will and bequeath to my
Wife of all the household furniture and plate possession
of the house where she now lives after Ambrose's death
lease of three years are expired on the Darling House
where Joshua Darg now lives with the two Negro Women
as named Sal and Phileas and on much stock and
utensils as my Trustee concerning ^{they} she has use for and further
I allow all the land to be leased out if there is more than
she can make use of. and that to be converted to the
use of raising and schooling my young children and
further Wills and decrees that she shall never want
any thing to support her for the term of life I fur-
ther will that her young children shall not be

= use the money then my trustees shall then and board
them out and send them to proper schools of Education
and the said board and schooling to be paid out of
the revenue of their own lands and I further
will that at her death that all the property
shall return to my legacies I further will and
decree that if my wife of choice takes her
third then my children to be taken away and
boarded out to schools of Education

Item I further will and decree that my three Negro
fellows shall be hired out yearly I further will that
all my Estate that is not yet mentioned either real
or personal shall be equally divided amongst all
my children only that part which shall fall
to my son Christopher he shall the revenue for
his children when they are of age Item I do furth-
er will and appoint that my good and faithful
friends David Finley and Joshua Burdett and
John Floyd and Alexander Collier and
