my wife, who is to be kept in the possession of
her share of this said real & Personal Estate
as well after my death as my Executors herein
after named may be able to make an
Equal Division. In the third place it is to
my desire that my Executor shall have
the Direction of the Education of my Children
during their minority & that he shall have
Power to give them such learning as he may
in his discretion may think best suits their
Situation & Capacities & of the property arising
from their Respective portions hereafter to them
