and a certain Tract known by the name of Grays
Tract and Timber to support the plantations, also my
Two work horses and a small Bay Filly, also four
Cows, and all my sheep and hogs, and all the Household
Furniture. and all my Farming Utensils and I do wish
them raise my children in Credit and to keep their
Moth^{er} from Suffering, and at her death I wish that
part of my Estate to be equally divided among my children

(113.) Daniel Cummins, Elizabeth Ford, Moses Cummins
Stephen Cummins, Hannah Cummins, Beulah

Daisy Cummins, also I do will and bequeath to my

In the fifth place it is my desire that if any
 Claim should arise against my Estate upon

 that my Executor shall have full power to compromise
 or settle any such Claim or Claims
 in any manner he may think best and may
 take any part of my Estate to satisfy any Claim
 that may be made good against my Estate

In the sixth place I do hereby ^{appoint} John Jones
 of Jamaica County the sole Executor of this my
 last will & Testament hereby revoking & annulling all
