Nothing Doubting in the General Resurrection
to obtain Happiness in the Life to Come and
principally and first.

I give and recommend my soul into the
hands of God who gave it.

1795 and as to my body. I commence to the Earth & be
buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my
Estate. and as concerning such worldly Estate as it
hath please God to bless me with in this Life.

I give devise and dispose of in manner and form
following. First That all my Lawful Debts be paid
by my Estate.

I will and bequeath to my
Children William Hovey, Christy Hovey, Henry Hovey
Peter Hovey Mary Hovey, son Michael Hovey
Harris John Hovey Harris and David Hovey Ten
Shillings each. Further I will and bequeath to my
Daughter Margaret Hovey all the remainder of my
Estate. To be kept and continued in the Hands of
my Estate. To be given to her or applied to her use
at their discretion as they see her necessity requires

and if after her decease if any part remain that
has not been applied for her use and maintenance
of her my Daughter Margaret, the remainder to be
Equally divided amongst my Children. and
further I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint
Christy Hovey Henry Hovey and William Hovey
my only and sole Executors of this my last will &
