calling to mind the mortality of my Body and
knowing it is appointed for all men Once to Die
Nothing Doubting in the General Resurrection
to obtain Happiness in the Life to Come and
principally and first.

I give and becommence my soul into the
hands of God who gave it.

1794 and as to my body. I commence to the Earth and
bequeath in a Secular manner at the Discretion of my
Children and as concerning such worldly Estate as it
hath please God to bless me with in this Life.

I give devise and Dispose of in manner and form
following. First That all my Lawful Debts be paid
by my Executors.

I will once bequeath to my
Children William Woodriffs, Christy Woodriffs, Henry Woodriffs,
Peter Woodriffs, Mary Hamilton, Michael Woodriffs,
Harris John Woodriffs Harris and David Woodriffs Ten
Shillings each. Further I will and bequeath to my
Daughter Margaret Woodriffs all the Remainder of my
Estate. To be kept and continued in the Hands of
my Executors. To be given to her or applied to her use
at their Discretion as they see her necessity requires

and if after her decease if any part remain that
has not been applied for her use and maintenance
of her my Daughter Margaret, the Remainder to be
Equally Divided amongst my Children. and
further I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint
Christy Woodriffs, Henry Woodriffs and William Hamilton
my only and sole Executors of this my last Will &c

in room I am [unclear] of [unclear] half a dozen
of [unclear] & I also do give my wife as much
Corn & Bacon, as may be sufficient to support
her & her Children during the Term of an year
after the death of my wife the above named
two dozen of [unclear] [unclear] [unclear]
to be returned for the benefit of all my
Children equally divided among them
