 of the County of Kanawha and State of Kentucky
 being weak in body but of sound mind and
 disposing my way do constitute and ordain
 this my last will and testament in manner
 and form following viz
 I trust of all my desire is that all my just
 Debts and funeral expenses be paid
 I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
 Anne English so long as she may live in this
 mortal life then my dearest Minny & her
 Child Isaac and Dolly also the purchase
 of the plantation whereon I now live to-
 gether with the timber on the said tract of
 land with the stock, plantation & the
 Wheelbarrow House and Kitchen furniture and
 the Crop that may be on the said plantation
 at the time that I may die also fifty pounds
 a part of a bond that Shamon Spencer
 Griffith Nathan Huston & Joseph has
 together with all the interest that may be
 on said bond untill paid
 I give and bequeath unto my Grand
 Children Hannah Chorney and Stephen
 English fifty pounds each or soon as the

money can be collected by my Executor hereafter
 as intended
 I do hereby will and desire that all my negroes -
 and other estate which heretofore has not
 been settled ~~will~~ at the death of my
 wife Anne English be equally divided
 between my Children Susannah
 Richardson Martha Richardson Stephen
 English Mary Smith's heirs as an child
 Anne Mary Rachel Stephens & Lucy
 East. Lastly I do constitute and appoint
 Stephen English & Jesse Richardson
 Executors to this my last will and
 testament hereby revoking all other
 = wills by me heretofore made In witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and affixed my seal this 28th Day of

 Books the of my money rising from my
 sale in Virginia which will appear to be my
 part whereunto I wish my son and
 Daughter W^m & Sally to share the Legacy
 equally my part of the sale money as
 above mentioned I do appoint ^{my} William
 & Nelson my whole Executor of my estate
 given under my hand and seal this
 8th Day of May 1806
