 State of health By the assisting hand of God
 upon my Body feel thanks be to his name
 I am Blesed with soundness of mind
 and memory and calling to mind that
 I must yield to death whenever providence
 calls for me I do hereby make this my
 last will and testament revoking and
 disannulling

all other wills by me hitherto
 made either verbally or in writing and desires
 this to be considered and taken by all men as my
 last will and testament and my desire is
 that the estate that providence has blessed me
 be disposed of after my decease in the following
 manner to wit. In the first place I give
 and bequeath to my oldest Son James living
 in Hagerman County Virginia thirty pounds
 current money in addition to what I have
 formerly given him which is all I intend
 to give him out of my estate I also give and
 bequeath to my Daughter Polly negro girl
 named Rithley to her and her heirs forever
 as also one hundred and ninety one acres of
 land being part of Lancers military
 Survey and numbered in the general plat
 for applicable to lines and corners making
 the same off on the ground to my Daughter
 Polly and her heirs forever I also give and
 bequeath to my son in law J. M. Hampden the
 plantation and all the improvements whereon
 I now live supposed to be about one hundred
 acres to him and his heirs forever I also
 give and bequeath to my son John a lot of
 land Lancers military survey designated in the
 plat N. 6 Six being that part of the survey
 which bounds upon the Ohio River to him

and his heirs forever I also give and bequeath
to my ^{son} William a lot of land in said Lewis
military Survey designated in the plot number
nine and contains one hundred acres to him.
and his heirs forever I give and bequeath to
my Granddaughter Polly and Daughter of
my son Frederick, assessed one lot of land in
in the said Lewis military Survey
designated in the plot number ten containing
one hundred acres to her and ^{her} heirs forever
and my will and desire is that after all
Just Debts and funeral expences is paid
that the whole of the remainder of my estate
be equally divided amongst my children -
herein after named to wit Joshua Joseph
William Brock Anne Brockes Judy Kasper
Hannah Mayfield Betty Boyd Lucy
Merck my Daughter Polly and my grand
Daughter Polly Burdett Daughter to my
son Frederick assessed my will and desire further
is if either of the Pollys that is to say my
Daughter and my Grand Daughter should
Depart this life without heirs lawfully begotten
of their Bodies then in that case the
Legacy or Legacies conveyed to them by
this will is to be sold and equally divided
amongst my children last named in this
will or their ^{heirs} if any of them should be
deceased

I Frederick Burdett Senior of the County
of Garret do make and declare this to be
a codicil to my last will and testament -
Ornit. whereas in my last will and testame-
-nt I have devised and directed that my
oldest son James Burdett of Fauquier
County Virginia do receive out my estate
thirty pounds current ^{money} and no more in full
of his legacy in my will as is herein to
be written I do hereby further give and
bequeath to my oldest son James Burdett
a tract of three hundred acres land lying
in the County of Scott adjoining a certain
of Daniel Bradford on the dividing ridge
(return)

between the waters of Egg Creek and
Elkhorn and the Spicy River which said
tract of land was entered by John L.
Bradford for me in my name and in
my name Surveyed the said Bradford
being by me paid for locating the said
land the whole of the said tract of land
being for the proper use and behoof of
my son James his heirs and assigns forever
with this promise that in case any part
or the whole of the aforesaid tract of land
should be lost by any other encroaching
claim or claims or by any other forfeiture
or forfeiture whatsoever that in any way
or manner his or my heirs or assigns the
title of the said my son James can in no
case come upon my estate or legates to make
the law in that case good but is simply
to have the said tract of land is now
stands without any promise to my estate
heirs or legates as Witness my hand and
Seal with my seal this 21st Day of
January 1801

It is my will and desire that my grandson
Joshua Hamper do have and possess after my
decease my negro boy named Edmund for his
proper use and behoof to him and his heirs
forever on the proviso that whenever my
grand son Joshua Hamper takes the said boy
Edmund into his possession he shall advance
and pay up to my Executors the sum of fifty
pounds good and lawful money of the said state
to be by my Executor equally divided amongst the
legates named in my last will or their heirs
except my granddaughter Polly Burdett as
Witness my hand and Seal with my seal this
Sixth Day of April 1802
