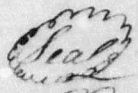

Agreeable to an Order of worshipful Court of Canada County Bearing July Court 1809 to its decreed me James Thompson John Gault and Henry Brown proceed to lay off and assign to Sancy Barlow widow of Henry Barlow Decd her right of Dower in and to the land and Shores that the said Henry Decd seized and possessor of which are as in the following manner (to wit) We do attest to the said widow ninety acres of land a part of the said tract of land that she now lies on to include the mansion house and is bounded as follows Beginning at three Beech trees a corner of William Duncans standing on the Bank of the South fork of Boons mill Creek and running from thence South two degrees East one hundred and sixteen poles with said Duncans line to a white marker in said line from thence more one hundred and forty poles to three Beech trees from thence South two degrees West eighty poles to an Elm and two Beech trees standing on the Bank of the aforesaid South fork of Boons mill Creek and from thence up the aforesaid white marker to the Beginning. Also we further do attest to her the said Sancy widow as appraised one negro Girl named Lucy given under our hands this 14th Day of June 1809
