I Henry Bingham of Canada County and
 born in the County of Kent in England
 Being Sick and weak in
 Body but of sound mind and Memory Do
 make and ordain this my last will and
 Testament that is to say first of all I give
 and recommend my Soul in to the hands of God who gave
 it and my Body to the earth to be buried in
 a Christian like and decent ^{manner} at the discretion
 of my Executors In promises it is my will
 and order that in the first place all my
 Just Debts and funeral Expenses be paid
 and Satisfied

Item I give and bequeath unto Mary Ann
 Bingham my dearly beloved wife the use
 of the plantation that I now live on
 together with all the household furniture

including all the wood and flax during her
 natural life also one Cow Staff two head of sheep
 (wethers) and two head of hogs and the use of ten apple
 trees During her life Item I give and bequeath
 unto my two sons John and Christian Bingham
 the plantation whereon I now live to be equally
 divided Between them to them and their heirs
 forever It is my will that my two sons John
 and Christian Bingham pay to all the rest
 of my heirs the Just and full Sum of two pounds
 current money of Kentucky on or before the
 expiration of eight years beginning at the date of
 paying ten pounds annually it is my will that
 all the rest of my property be sold and disposed of
 at the direction of my Executors Thereby to pay and
 disburse all former will bequeaths or debts of
 this and nothing to be my last will and testament
 nominating and appointing my two sons
 John and Christian Bingham my Executors
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and affixed my seal this 1st of November
 1807 Signed Sealed and acknowledged in the
