he should say which was in words following viz
that my son Augustus England should
hold & lease in my Land as first agreed
upon between himself and me, without distur-
-bance & that my wife Mary England
shall hold a quiet possession of the balance
of the Land during life and after her death
that my son James England shall enjoy
a quiet and peaceable possession of
all my Land with Augustus's share (after
its expiration) upon condition that he pays
all my debts as witnesses our hands this
12th day of November 1807
