Brasfield deceased her Dower in the negroes
and Land of said Edward Brasfield
Deceased Did on the 19th Day of December
1805 after being sworn go personally on
the said with William Croft Surveyor
for that purpose and then and there do
ascertain By metes and Bounds the said
Nancy Brasfield widow of aforesaid
Dower and into the Land of said Edward Brasfield
Deceased having at the same time regard to the
quantity quality and improvements

of said Land which said widows part of Dower
after being ascertained is Bounded as follows -
Begining at a stake as marked on
the plat here with pole and made a part of
this report thence North 50 degrees West
to an ash tree and line at B. on said plat
thence South 50 Degrees West 120 poles to an
elm Sugar tree and reached at C thence
South 44th East 412 poles to a sugar tree and
elm at D thence South 41 East 123 poles
to a stake thence to the Beginning containing
61 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres which said Boundary in the said
commencement as afore as the said widows right
of Dower in and to the said of which said Edward
Brasfield's Did possess was the said commission
as do further report that we do likewise on
the 19th Day of Decr 1805 after being first
sworn a pledge to the said ^{widow} and her right
Dower and to the Slaves of which the said
Edward Did possess of tract negro property -
Samuel & Elijah. we a sign as the said right
of Dower in and to the Slaves of said Edward
Brasfield's Did. Give under our hands and
Seals this 21st Day of July 1806
