I give, devise and dispose of it in manner and form following Viz I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret Brown after the payment of all my Just Debts: all and singular the whole of my real and personal estate

for her

for her to possess and Enjoy during her natural life but at her death it is my will that my Son David Brown shall have the said whereon I now live supposed to contain seventy five acres in the said David is also to have my negro man named Cass. Item I give and bequeath to my two Sons Will^m and John Brown ten Shillings each to be Laid and raised out of my Estate Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter — Sister Jane Riggs ten Shillings to be Laid and raised out of my estate. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Pharis my negro woman named Cherry with her increase —

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Margaret — Harriet my negro woman named Sally with her increase. Item I give and to my Daughter Elizabeth Jennings a negro Child that now sucks her — Another Cherry and is the only Child she has living it is a female Child —

Item I give and bequeath to my sons — Grand Joseph Robert and Charles all the remainder of movable estate that may be left at the Death of my wife Margaret Brown to be equally ^{divided} among them three and I do Ordain, Constitute and appoint my trusty Friends Edmond Smith & William Wallace to be executors of this my last will and testament and to have the said

I do hereby revoke and disallow and make
void any other will or wills heretofore by me
made declaring this; and this only be my last will
and testament in writing in hereof I have hereunto

December 1802 -

lawful age I give and bequeath the said negro boy
Bond to them & their heirs forever and in case either
should Depart this life before they arrive of lawful
age it is then my desire that the Survivor shall
have the negro boy Bond and in the event that
both of them should Depart this life before they
arrive of lawful age not leaving lawful issue it
is then my desire that the said negro boy Bond
shall descend my two children Morehead & Morehead
& George & Morehead to them and their heirs forever
I give & bequeath to my son Plendon
my negro girl Maria and her future increase
to him and his heirs forever and it is also my
desire that in case either of my last mentioned
sons should Depart this life before the arrival of lawful
age I give and bequeath to my son George
& Morehead my negro girl Esther and her future
increase to him and his heirs forever and it is also
my desire that in case of my last mentioned sons
should Depart this life before they arrive of
lawful age or shall have lawful issue that
then the Survivor of my said two sons shall
inherit the said two negro girls Maria & Esther
& their increase as aforesaid and further it is my
desire that in case my said two sons Plendon
& George should Depart this life before they arrive of
lawful age and not leaving lawful issue
that then the said two negro girls Maria and Esther
& their increase shall descend to my children Lucy and
Morehead
