

Agreeable to an order of the Honorable Justices
 Court of Garrard County bearing date
 May Court 1867 We Benjamin Lister
 William Jennings & Thomas Buford
 being first sworn do certify to Peggy Ann
 widow of Reuben Arnold Dea her town
 in the Land of which her late husband
 Reuben died ~~deceased~~ and proposed off it being
 the Tract of Land and Plantation that
 he Resided on Containing 1500 acres and we
 do lay off 50 acres to include the mansion
 house for her said third bounded as follow-
 - us (to wit) beginning at a black walnut
 tree standing on the side of the Hickman
 Road and nearly in the line of James
 A. Bridges from thence N 30 W 68 poles
 with said A. Bridges line to his corner
 a bush and Sugar tree standing also
 near the aforesaid Road from thence
 W 48 poles to a stake from thence
 S 8 W 100 poles crossing Bacon's mill
 Creek to a bush and Sugar tree
 in the line of Mumfords Land and
 from thence S 60 E 75 poles with
 Mumfords line to two bush Saplings
 in said line from thence N 14 E 88
 poles crossing the creek to the beginning

The ⁴⁰Logwood belonging to said Deceased
 Estate being so unequally in Value that we
 cannot divide in kind so as to allot ^{the} ~~the~~
 Peggy as of her said ^{share} ~~share~~ equally to ~~an~~ ^{her}
 one equal share part as her own given
 under our hands this 1st Day of June 1867

 body but of sound mind and memory
 do make and obtain this my last will
 and Testament that is to say first of all
 I give and recommend my soul in to the
 hands of God who gave it and my body
 to the Earth to be buried in Christian like
 and decent manner at the discretion of my
 Executors. Impressed, It is my will and
 I do order in the first place that all my debts
 and funeral ~~charges~~ ^{just} be paid and satisfied

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I then, I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth
and my dearly beloved wife. the use of
the Plantation that I now live on together
with all the moveable property and
household furniture & sugar camp also
during in life time. I then I give and
Bequeath unto my two sons John Reed
and Amos Reed the tract of land
that I now live on to be divided by a
line from the beginning corner to the
line where it crosses the branch that runs
through the field John Reed the upper
part and Amos Reed the lower part
I then, I give and Bequeath unto Richard
Reed the slave man and the white
boy, I then, I ordain John and Amos
Reed give David McCollum six pounds
a piece when he is twenty years of age
I then, I allow Rufus Carpenter to have the
care David McCollum until he is twenty
one years of age and he must give him
two years schooling I then I give and
Bequeath unto John Maize five shillings
of my Estate I then I give and bequeath
unto Richard Parkin four shillings
of my Estate

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I therefore revoke and disannul all
previous wills Bequeaths or acts of gifts
ratifying and confirming this and
no other to be my last will and testament
naming and appointing Elizabeth
Reed and Rufus Carpenter my Executors
in witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and affixed my seal this
29 day of January 1808
