man named Joseph, Daniel, Henry, Jupi-
-ter and John and my negro Women named
Lucy and another named Nancy and as
for the young negro Children that belong
to me that are under age my will and
desire is that my executor do put them
out to be instructed in plantation bus-
-iness so that they may be capable to
maintain a living for themselves when they
arrive at the age of twenty one years,
or if my executor should have to bind
any of them to learn a Mechanical occu-
-pation he may bind them out until
they arrive at the age of Twenty one and
no longer at which period they are
to be like men and women my will and
desire is that the negroes shall continue
and remain on the plantation until
the the whole of the present crop that
is now on hand shall be completely
finished and sold off before three
freedoms shall commence. I also give and
bequeath unto my friend Josiah of Lin-
-coln county all the books of every kind
belonging to me for his sole use and
benefit for ever my will and desire is
that the whole of my estate of every

kind plantation ^{the} man's household
and kitchen furniture and every
other species of property that belongs
to me and that is upon the said plan-
-tation with the surplus now on
hand. the whole of the property to
be sold on a twelve months Credit by
my executor and after my funeral
expenses and Just debts are paid the
surplus of the amount of sale to be
collected and ^{by} my executor put out
on interest, and it is further my desire
that the widowed Boucan take my neg-
-ro man named Giles under her care and
for his maintenance this ensuing year.
she is to have two hundred and
fifty weight of pork and three bar-
-rels of corn and for every year after
-wards during his life the said widowed
Boucan is to have at the rate of five
pounds per year for his diet and cloth-
-ing to be paid by my executor out
of the interest of the said surplus
money that remains after all debts and
demands that may come against my
