 in my disposing mind and memory -
 therefore calling to mind the mortality of my
 body knowing that it is appointed for all
 men once to lie so make and ordain this

my last will and testament that is to say principally
 and first of all, I give and recommend my
 Soul into the hands of almighty God who gave it
 and my body to the earth to be buried in a
 decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my
 Executors &c. and as touching such worldly estate
 whereunto it hath pleased God to bless me in
 this life having disposed of a part thereof amongst
 my children already by way of advancement
 therefore the balance of what yet remains in
 my possession I give and demise and dispose
 of in the following manner and force to -
 wit I give and bequeath to ^{my} my
 Dear wife that part of the plan-
 tation and improvement including the main-
 tenance ^{house} on which I now live and ^{boundaries} ~~boundaries~~ ^{as}
 Beginning at the mouth of a small Drain
 that empties ~~that~~ into the branch below the
 house, thence up said Drain through the back
 lane by ~~the~~ the grave yard a straight line
 to the corner of the big field fence thence a
 straight line to the nearest corner of son Wm's
 orchard fence thence with my line all the way
 to the Beginning my two Slaves also Nickel and
 Dick my horse Policy and ^{for} Somet Horses and
 saddle three beds and furniture my Chest
 and my two Bibles all of which ^{have they free} shall
 and uninterrupted use of During his life
 but it shall be at the discretion of my
 Executors

Executors if to them it may appear necessary
for her decent support in case the provisions
already made for her should by some unfor-
seen providence prove insufficient to
keep ~~and~~ in reserve as much money out
of my estate as will reasonably answer
that purpose making a fair statement of
all the money thus laid out, being
answerable for any unnecessary waste
and at her death it is my will that
Dick be offered to my son & Michael at
the price of fifty pounds if he chooses to
take him at that well if not ~~take him~~
then to be sold to the highest bidder amongst
the legators but not out of the family also the
other property to be sold (except her three beds
and their furniture viz. Bed & Chest
to be wholly at her disposal) all which money
shall be divided as hereafter prescribed
Then I give and bequeath to my youngest
son Josiah Wallace the plantation whereon
I now live but he shall lay no claim to nor
have any right in the possession of that part
bequeathed to his Mother her lifetime but after
her death the whole of said tract of land shall
be his and his heirs forever also a bed and its
furniture a young sowed mare a cow and her
increase four sheep and a rifle gun all my
Books except two Bibles above mentioned

and the ten volumes of Urskine thus making
him fully up to his other Brothers advancements
It is to be under stood that the most of the above
creations were called his hope and these are the
same I still allow him. And with respect to
the ten volumes of Urskine I give and bequeath
them in the following manner First to son
William the second to Daughter Hannah the
third to son John, the fourth to son Michael
the fifth to son Allen the sixth to Daughter
Elizabeth, the seventh to Daughter Sarah, the
eighth to son Josiah and the other two and the
two Bibles to their Mother while she lives and
and them to whomsoever of her sons or Daughters
She pleases, With respect to 150 acres of land in
dispute being a tract I bought of Mr. Bide and
to my son Allen and returned ^{back} from him to me
I give and bequeath the chance of one half the
price to James Anderson my son-in-law for his
trouble and expences in obtaining the same
in whom I appoint to conduct that business and if
obtained to be divided as hereafter directed but
if Anderson does not choose to act upon this
principal I allow him and son Wm to join and
carry on the Suit paying them out of my estate
the expences &c.
and if they obtain the land or recover any thing con-
-cerning the same this way shall be divided as
herein after directed

Item I give and bequeath to my son John all
that he is due me for a mare he bought of
me &c which I suppose is something under
twenty pounds.

Item I give and bequeath to Polly wife a
Step Daughter of my Daughter Mary Giles
the two beds and ~~and~~ furniture her Step-
mother had and also the prices of the Horses
that were sold as hers that son Wm kept and
raised &c

I direct as soon as convenient that all my
personal estate be sold (the above bequests excepted)
and all the money arising from the premises
before mentioned after my just debts and
funeral charges be paid then first there
shall be paid to Daughter Sarah thirty three
and two thirds, to son Michael eighty Dollars
and to Daughter Elizabeth fifty Dollars, the
intentions of this is to make them up equal to
their other brothers and sisters advan-
=ments and then the Balance of whatever
may be left I order to be equally divided
amongst my following Children and one
Grand Child viz Wm Wallace Hannah
Anderson Michael Wallace & Peter Wallace
Elizabeth Shannon Sarah Jeff Josiah Wallace
and my son John Wallres son Bartley
Wallace. I do ^{hereby} constitute make and
ordain and appoint my well beloved wife
Anne Wallace Executor and my said

Wm Wallace Executor of this my last will
and testament, and I do hereby utterly disavow
revoke and disannul all and every other former
testaments wills legacies bequests and Executors
by me in any wise before named made and
bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and
no other to be my last will and testament.
